


Residents of Somerville



*When it snows, it's important to plow our streets quickly and completely. Plowed streets make it easier for police, fire and rescue squads to respond to emergencies and are much more convenient and safe for everyone. Specific areas that are particularly affected include one-way streets, hills and narrow passages. You can help by removing your car from **all** Borough streets, roads and highways during a snow emergency*

Below is an overview of the **Borough's Snow Emergency Parking Policy.**

It is illegal for any vehicle to be parked on any Borough road, street or highway when the ground is snow covered. "Snow covered" means any precipitation that accumulates on the streets, roads or highways, including snow, sleet, hail, ice or freezing rain. If **any** vehicle remains on the street, road or highway in such a circumstance, the Somerville Police may ticket it or have it removed. This policy remains in effect until the roads are sufficiently cleared to allow the normal flow of traffic as determined by the Public Works Manager or his assistant.

Easy ways to avoid problems when roads are snow covered:

- ◆ Move your car up into your, or a neighbor's driveway so that it is not in the road.
- ◆ If you do not have a driveway, move your car to one of the three Borough Lots located between Main and South Streets, Maple and Davenport Streets and Davenport Street and Doughty Avenue. These areas will be plowed first.
- ◆ If you have any questions concerning this policy or the conditions of the roads, please contact the **Public Works Office** at (908)704-6961.
- ◆ If you cannot move your car off the street, or for any other emergency, call the **Somerville Police Department** at (908)725-0331, or the Public Works Department.

NOTE: All property owners, including commercial & professional are reminded that they have 12 daylight hours upon completion of any snowfall to clean their sidewalks.
