The pledge of allegiance was recited by those in attendance.

Mayor Gallagher asked for a moment of silence to honor the passing of Dr. Richard Goldsmith. Mayor Gallagher noted the accomplishments over his number of years of service to the Somerville community. He will be missed and all of his commitment will be remember.

ARTICLE I General Provisions

§ 166-1. Definitions.

Whenever any words or phrases are used in this chapter, the meanings respectively ascribed to them in Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey shall be deemed to apply to such words and phrases used herein.

§ 166-2. Repealer.

All former ordinances of the Borough of Somerville are hereby repealed, except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or committed in violation of any ordinance hereby repealed prior to the taking effect of this chapter.

§ 166-3. Severability.

If any part or parts of this chapter are held to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this chapter.

§ 166-4. Violations and penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey statute, or except as specifically provided in some other section of this chapter, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this chapter or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or both.

§ 166-4.1 Penalties expressly listed in this ordinance

Penalties for violations of the following provisions of this ordinance are expressly provided in the ordinance as:

Permit Parking Violation – Chapter 166-10.1 Thirty Dollars (\$30.00)

Emergency No-Parking- Chapter 166-10.2 Forty Dollars (\$40.00)

Meter Violations – Chapter 166-68.1 Forty Dollars (\$40.00)

Parking Deck Parking Violation – Chapter 166-100 (A) Forty Dollars (\$40.00)

ARTICLE II Parking

§ 166-5. Regulations not exclusive.

The provisions of this Article imposing a time limit on parking shall not relieve any person of the duty to observe other and more restrictive provisions prohibiting or limiting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles as set forth in N.J.R.S. 39:4-138, any other New Jersey statute or as hereinafter provided.

§ 166-6. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule I, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-7. Parking prohibited during certain hours.

A. No person shall park a vehicle between the hours specified in Schedule II of any day upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule II, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

B. No truck over four (4) tons shall be parked on any street between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., including Sundays and holidays.

§ 166-8. Stopping and standing prohibited.

No person shall stop or stand a vehicle during the time specified in Schedule III, of any day, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule III, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-9. Parking time limited.

No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit shown in Schedule IV at any time between the hours listed in said Schedule IV, of any day, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule IV, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-10. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule V, attached to and made a part of this chapter, except at the angle designated and only within the painted white stall lines.

§ 166-10.1. Permit parking. [Added 10587 by Ord. No. 1030]

- A. [Amended 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134; 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114] No vehicle shall be parked on the streets or parts of streets designated in Schedule VA and Schedule VB, attached hereto and made a part of this chapter, during the hours designated in the schedule, Monday through Friday, unless:
- (1) The vehicle is owned or operated on a regular basis by a resident of that street and the vehicle has displayed on its left rear window, in such a manner as to be accessible to visible examination by an officer, a current residential parking permit.
 - (2) The vehicle falls under one (1) of the exceptions to the parking ban.
- B. The following vehicles shall be exempt from this parking permit section:
- (1) Visitors. A vehicle displaying a current visitor parking permit may park on any of the controlled streets described on Schedule VA and Schedule VB, provided that the operator of the vehicle is a bona fide guest of the residence within the permit parking area. The visitor's permit shall be displayed on the dashboard of the vehicle in such a manner as to be clearly visible by an officer enforcing parking regulations. [Amended 6-1-92 by Ord.  - (2) Contractors, service and delivery vehicles. Contractors, service and delivery vehicles bearing the name and address of a commercial business may park without a permit during the time they are rendering service to a residence within the permit parking area.
 - (3) Emergency vehicles. Emergency vehicles and public service, telephone and other public utility vehicles may park within the permit parking area during the time they are rendering service or repairs within that area.
 - (4) Parking of vehicles as exempted in Section 166-46.2. [Added 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114]
- C. Administration. Application for parking permits under this section shall be made in writing on forms provided to the Borough Clerk-Administrator or his designee. Permits shall be granted by the Clerk-Administrator under the following terms and conditions:
- (1) To persons who are residents on said street or portion thereof upon which parking is restricted by this section, a permanent permit, valid for one (1) year, shall be issued for every vehicle owned or principally operated by such person. There shall be no limit on the number of permits which may be issued to any one (1) household. In the event a structure on said street or portion thereof upon which parking is restricted by this section shall contain a nonresidential use, then said nonresidential use shall be limited to two (2) permits. [Amended 9-19-94 by Ord. No. 1181]
 - (2) Two (2) visitor permits shall be issued to each residential unit on any street or portion thereof upon which parking is restricted by this section for use only by visitors to that residential unit.
- D. Violations. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this section for any person to:
- (1) Cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in his name or operated by such person to be parked in any of the areas designated on the attached Schedule VA and Schedule VB as established as a decal parking zone as herein described unless said vehicle displays a proper and current decal in accordance with this section. [Amended 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134; 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114]
 - (2) Willfully defraud, misuse or improperly obtain any decal so as the decal is used for a vehicle or person not entitled to use that decal as described under the provision of this section.
- E. Penalty.
- (1) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of Subsection D(1) as set forth therein shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine of thirty dollars (\$30.). [Amended 7-6-92 by Ord. No. 1123] (Amended Ordinance 2477-15-0817)
 - (2) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with the provisions of Subsection D(2) as set forth therein or who aids or abets any such violation or failure to

comply with that subsection shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days, either or both of those penalties to be imposed at the discretion of the court.

§ 166-10.2. Emergency no parking. [Added 3-7-88 by Ord. No. 1037; amended 9-6-94 by Ord. No. 1182]

- A. Parking of any vehicle on any portion of a borough public road, street or highway is prohibited whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that the road, street or highway is snow covered, an emergency shall exist and no vehicle shall be parked on the following streets or highways or portions thereof, all municipality owned streets or highways.
- B. The above parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic, to be determined by the Office of Emergency Management. [Amended 3-3-14 by Ord. No. 2431]
- C. As used in this chapter, the term snow covered shall mean any precipitation depositing any accumulation on the streets, roads or highways, including snow, sleet, hail, ice or freezing rain, which requires plowing, salting or sanding.
- D. As to Subsection A of this section, regulatory and warning signs in accordance with N.J.S.A. 39:4-198 shall be erected and maintained at all street, road or highway entrances for motor vehicles into this municipality.
- E. During extreme weather conditions when a vehicle is not able to proceed and must be parked on any street, road or highway in the borough, the operator of such vehicle must, by the quickest means of communication, notify the Department of Public Works of the Borough of Somerville of such vehicle.
- F. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this section shall be deemed a nuisance and menace to the safe and proper regulations of traffic and any police officer may provide for removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of removal and storage which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.
- G. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this section shall be liable to a penalty of forty dollars (\$40.00) (Ordinance 2477-15-0817)
- H. Upon the declaration of an emergency there shall be no parking upon any public road, street or highway or portion thereof in the Borough of Somerville where either a permanent or temporary EMERGENCY NO PARKING sign is displayed. The Mayor of the Borough of Somerville, or his duly appointed representative, with advice from the Borough Engineer, Chief of Police and the Fire Chief, is authorized to declare such emergency and to direct the posting of temporary EMERGENCY NO PARKING signs when, in his judgment, weather conditions, accident, fire, public celebration or other similar emergency requires the avoidance of hazards or other conditions which interfere with the free flow of traffic. Notification that EMERGENCY NO PARKING signs are being or will be posted shall be given to the operator or owner of any vehicle which has been parked prior to the posting of said signs. Placing written advice of such posting on or in such a parked vehicle shall be deemed sufficient notification hereunder.
- I. Upon the declaration of the emergency the Chief of Police may order that vehicles that remain in prohibited areas may be towed. Such costs including any administrative costs, storage or any costs arising from the tow shall be charged against the owner of the vehicle

ARTICLE III Truck Exclusions

§ 166-11. Truck over four tons excluded.

Trucks over four (4) tons' gross weight are hereby excluded from the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VI, except for the pickup and delivery of materials on such streets, said Schedule VI being attached to and made a part of this chapter [NOTE: The minimum weight limit permitted pursuant to N.J.R.S. 40:67.16.1 is four (4) tons.]

ARTICLE IV One-Way Streets

§ 166-12. One way streets designated.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated.

ARTICLE V Stop and Yield Intersections

§ 166-13. Through streets designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-140, the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VIII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as through streets. Stop signs shall be

installed on the near right side of each street intersecting the through street except where yield signs are provided for in the designations.

§ 166-14. Stop intersections designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-140, the intersections described in Schedule IX, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as stop intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided therein.

§ 166-15. Yield intersections designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-140, the intersections described in Schedule X, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as yield intersections. Yield signs shall be installed as provided therein.

ARTICLE VI Special Zones and Areas

§ 166-16. Loading zones designated.

The locations described in Schedule XI, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as loading zones.

§ 166-17. Taxi stands designated.

The locations described in Schedule XII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as taxi stands.

§ 166-18. Bus stops designated; midblock crosswalks.

A. Bus stops designated. The locations described in Schedule XIII A, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as bus stops.

B. Midblock crosswalks. The locations described in Schedule XIII B, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as midblock crosswalks.

ARTICLE VII Turn Prohibitions

§ 166-19. U-turns.

No person shall make a U-turn on any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XIV, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-20. Turns at intersections.

No person shall make a turn of the kind designated (left, right, all) at any of the locations described in Schedule XV, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-21. Right and left turn lane reservations.

Lanes for right- or left-hand turns only, as indicated, are hereby reserved upon the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XVI, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

ARTICLE VIII (Reserved)

§ 166-22 through 166-25. (Reserved)

ARTICLE IX Speed Limits

§ 166-26. Limits established.

The speed limit for both directions of traffic along the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XVIII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, is hereby established at the rate of speed indicated.

§ 166-27. Posting of signs.

Regulatory and warning signs shall be erected and maintained to effect the above-designated speed limits as authorized by the Department of Transportation.

ARTICLE X Traffic Control Signals

§ 166-28. Traffic signals established.

Traffic control signals shall be installed and operated at the intersection of those streets described in Schedule XIX, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-29. Installation of signals.

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The traffic signal installation shall be in accordance with the provisions of an Act Concerning Motor Vehicles and Traffic Regulations, Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the New Jersey Revised Statutes and shall conform to the design and shall be maintained in operation as authorized by the Department of Transportation of the State of New Jersey.

ARTICLE XI No-Passing Zones

§ 166-30. No passing zones established.

No-passing zones are hereby established and maintained along those streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XX, attached to and made a part of this chapter, as authorized by the New Jersey Department of Transportation in accordance with the sketches dated and numbered as indicated.

ARTICLE XII Street Cleaning

§ 166-31. No parking for street cleaning.

[Amended 5-6-13 by Ord. No. 2414-13-0415]

No person shall park a vehicle between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on the days specified upon any street or parts of street described in Schedule XXI from March 1 through October 31. All street cleaning regulations are suspended in the months of November, December, January and February.

ARTICLE XIII Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital

§ 166-32. Applicability.

The provisions of Subtitle 1, Title 39, of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey having heretofore, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:5-1 et seq., been made applicable to the property of the Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, a corporation of a public or semipublic character not for pecuniary profit, incorporated under Title 15 of the New Jersey Revised Statutes, lying along and easterly of Rehill Avenue, in the Borough of Somerville. The additional regulations of this Article are hereby made applicable to all the semipublic or private roads, streets, driveways, trails, terraces, bridle paths, parkways, parking areas or other roadways on said property of said hospital.

§ 166-33. (Reserved)

§ 166-34. Parking on or adjacent to semicircular driveway.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, on or upon any part of the semicircular driveway in front of the main hospital building on the easterly side of Rehill Avenue, opposite Steele Avenue, or in or upon any space or area adjacent to said driveway, except a doctor attending at the hospital in his professional capacity in response to an emergency call to minister to the needs of a patient or patients, and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary incident to such emergency.

§ 166-35. Restricted or reserved spaces.

No person other than a doctor attending at the hospital in his or her professional capacity to minister to the needs of a patient or patients shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area restricted or reserved, as indicated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof, as a space or area for the parking of doctors' vehicles.

§ 166-36. Manner of parking.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any manner other than parallel to or at such angle to the side line of or passageway through the particular parking space or area as shall be indicated by signs erected thereon and by markings on the surface thereof.

§ 166-37. Conformance with stall markings required.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area wherein parking is permitted except within and in the manner indicated by stalls marked on the surface of the particular parking space or area.

§ 166-38. Vehicular or pedestrian passageways; speed limits.

- A. No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof, as either a vehicular or pedestrian passageway.
- B. No person shall use, or cause to be used, any vehicular or pedestrian passageway through or over any part of the aforesaid property of the Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital solely for through passage from one public street to another public street, or for any purpose other than as means of entrance to or exit from the buildings or property of the said hospital.

- C. Speed limits. Speed limits are hereby established in the following area: within the block bounded on the west by Rehill Avenue, on the south by Grant Avenue, on the east by Post Street and on the north by Lincoln Avenue. No person shall operate a vehicle in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour on any portion of the aforementioned property.

§ 166-39. Loading areas.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof as a loading area.

§ 166-40. Handicapped parking. [Amended 3491 by Ord. No. 1094; 11/15/93 by Ord. No. 1158; 12/16/03 by Ord. No. 2153]

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by marking on the surface thereof as a restricted parking space for use by a handicapped person unless such person had been issued a special vehicle identification card or handicap plates or placard, by the Division of Motor Vehicles. Any person parking a motor vehicle in a restricted parking space without such special vehicle identification card, handicap plates or placard, shall be liable to a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.) and up to two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) for a first offense and, for subsequent offenses, a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) and ninety (90) days of community service on such terms and in such form as the Court shall deem appropriate, or any combination thereof. These restricted areas are more specifically described in Section 166-81.

Notice of these restricted spaces shall be given to the public by placing a sign at all designated places as more specifically described in Section 166-81. All signs designating a restricted parking space shall conform to the specifications of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for streets and highways. These signs shall be so placed as to be easily read by pedestrians or operators of vehicles. In addition, any sign erected after June 1, 1990, shall state the penalties set forth herein which may be imposed for a violation. Any sign erected prior to June 1, 1990 shall be modified by June 1, 1991 to include the penalty information. The municipality may, by resolution, establish restricted parking in front of a residence or other housing unit for use by handicapped persons, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39: 4-197.5 or N.J.S.A. 39: 4-197.6.

§ 166-41. Stop intersections.

The following described intersections are hereby described as stop intersections:

The main access drive from Rehill Avenue (opposite Steele Avenue) to Post Street with the access drives (2) to the main parking lot Exits (2) from the main parking lot (southbound)

The main access drive from Rehill Avenue (opposite Steele Avenue) to Post Street with the semicircular drive which passes the main entrance Exit from the semicircular drive which passes the main entrance (northbound)

ARTICLE XV Metered Parking

§ 166-62.1. Definitions.

The following words and phrases, which are not defined in Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey, shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section for the purposes of this Article.

PARKING METER-PAY STATION (Metering Device) Any mechanical or electro-mechanical or digital device or meter, not inconsistent with this Article, placed or erected for the regulation of parking by authority of this Article. Each “metering device” installed shall indicate by proper legend the legal parking time established by the borough and, when operated, shall at all times indicate the balance of legal parking time and, at the expiration of such period, shall indicate illegal or overtime parking.

PARKING METERED SPACE-Any space within a parking metered zone, adjacent to a parking metering device, and which is duly designated for the parking of a single vehicle by lines painted or otherwise durably marked on the curb or on the surface of the street or lot adjacent to or adjoining the metering device.

PARKING METERED ZONE-Any restricted street or off-street parking lot upon which parking metering devices are installed and in operation.

§ 166-63. Designation of parking spaces.

The Chief of Police or designee is hereby directed and authorized to provide for the marking off of individual parking spaces in the parking zones designated and described in § 166-65 of this Article, said parking spaces to be designated by lines painted or marked on the curbing or surface of the street or lot. At each space so marked off, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle in such a way that said vehicle shall not be entirely within the limits of the space so designated.

§ 166-64. Installation of parking metering devices.

In said parking metered zones the Chief of Police or designee shall cause parking metering devices to be installed upon the curb, sidewalk or area immediately adjacent to the parking spaces provided in § 166-65 of this Article. No parking metering devices shall be installed in areas where parking is prohibited pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-138. The Chief of Police shall be responsible for the regulation, control, operation, maintenance and use of such parking meters. Each device shall be so set as to display the legal parking time upon the deposit of the appropriate coin, lawful money of the United States of America, for the period of time prescribed by said section. Each device shall be so arranged that, upon the expiration of the lawful time limit, it will indicate by a proper, visible signal that the lawful parking period has expired, and in such case the right of such vehicle to occupy such space shall cease, and the operator, owner, possessor or manager thereof shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter provided.

It shall be unlawful, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, to park or stand a vehicle in excess of the time indicated in the areas described below:

Parking is free on street and in lots 1, 2, 4, 6 & 7 on Sunday.

HOLIDAY PARKING – Every Saturday between Thanksgiving Day and New Year’s day shall be free in Lots 1,2, & 6

§ 166-66. Operation of parking meters.

Except in a period of emergency determined by an officer of the Fire or Police Department, or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control sign or signal, when any vehicle shall be parked in any

parking space alongside or next to which a parking metering device is located, the operator of such vehicle shall, upon entering the said parking metered space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited in said metering device such proper coin or accepted currency of the United States of America as is required for such parking meter and as is designated by proper directions on the metering device, and when required by the directions on the metering device, the operator of such vehicle, after the deposit of the proper coin, or accepted currency shall also set in operation the timing mechanism on such metering device in accordance with directions properly appearing thereon, and failure to deposit such proper coin or accepted currency and to set the timing mechanism in operation when so required shall constitute a violation of this Article. Upon the deposit of such coin or accepted currency (and the setting of the timing mechanism in operation when so required), the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle during the period of time which has been prescribed for the part of the street in which said parking space is located, provided that any person placing a vehicle in a parking meter space adjacent to a metering device which indicates that unused time has been left in the meter by the previous occupant of the space shall not be required to make a deposit of currency so long as his occupancy of said space does not exceed the indicated unused parking time. If said vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space beyond the parking time limit set for such parking space and if the meter shall indicate such illegal parking, then and in that event such vehicle shall be considered as parking overtime and beyond the period of legal parking time, and such parking shall be deemed a violation of this Article.

§ 166-67. Manner of parking.

When a parking meter space is diagonal to the curb or sidewalk, no person shall park or permit the parking of any vehicle in such parking space in any other position than with the foremost part of such vehicle nearest to the parking metering device

No person shall park or permit the parking of any vehicle in such parking space in any other position than with the foremost part of such vehicle nearest to the curb; provided, however, that in the municipal off-street parking lots, signs shall be erected indicating that head-on parking only is permitted. In any event, a vehicle shall be parked within the lines marked on the pavement measuring such parking space.

§ 166-68. Violations.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this Article for any person to:

- A. Cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in the name of or operated by such person to be parked overtime or beyond the period of legal parking time established for any parking metered zone as herein described, or to deposit in any parking meter any coin or accepted currency for the purpose of parking beyond the maximum legal parking time for the particular parking meter zone.
- B. Permit any vehicle to remain or be placed in any parking space adjacent to any parking metered space while said metering device is displaying a signal indicating that the vehicle occupying such parking space has already been parked beyond the period prescribed for such parking space.
- C. Park any vehicle across any line or marking of a parking metered space or in such position that the vehicle shall not be entirely within the area designated by such lines or markings.
- D. Deface, injure, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking metering device installed under the provisions of this Article.
- E. Deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter any slug, device or metal substance or other substitute for lawful coins or accepted currency.
- F. Park or permit the parking of any vehicle in any parking metered space where the meter does not register lawful parking.

§ 166-68.1. Violations specific to certain sections. [Added 6-20-88 by Ord. No. 1049]

- A. Any violation of § 166-68A, B, C shall be punishable by a fine of forty dollars (\$40.) per violation. [Amended 6-5-95 by Ord. No. 1188; 2-21-12 by Ord. No. 2376-12-0117]
- B. Any violation of § 166-68D or E shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) as determined by the court.
- C. Fines shall be established by ordinance. Each year fines shall be evaluated. If the State of New Jersey adds certain charges or costs onto summons violations, said summons violations shall be increased by the same amount automatically.

§ 166-69. Reports of violations; citations.

A. It shall be the duty of the police officers, or Parking Enforcement Officer acting in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief of Police, to report:

- (1) The number of each parking metering device or metered space which indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent to such parking metering device is or has been parked in violation of any of the provisions of this Article.
- (2) The state license number of such vehicle.
- (3) That such vehicle is parked in violation of any of the provisions of this Article.
- (4) Any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation.

B. Each such police officer or Parking Enforcement Officer shall also attach to such vehicle a notice to the owner thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of a provision of this Article and instructing such owner to report to the Municipal Court in regard to such violation.

§ 166-70. Impounding of vehicles.

Any vehicle left parked for a period exceeding the maximum parking time indicated during the hours of operation specified in the space in which the vehicle is parked shall be towed, under the direction of the Police Department, to a garage or other place designated by the Chief of Police for impoundment, subject to redemption by the owner upon payment of the reasonable cost of towing and a storage for each day or portion thereof during which it remains in said garage or other place.

§ 166-71. Purpose of meter deposits.

The coins or accepted currency required to be deposited in parking meters as provided herein are hereby levied and assessed as fees to provide for the proper regulation and control of traffic upon the public streets and also the cost of supervising and regulating the parking of vehicles in the parking metered zones created hereby and to cover the cost of the purchase, supervision, protection, inspection, installation, operation, maintenance, control and use of the parking metering devices described herein.

§ 166-72. Collection of coins or currency from metered devices; disposition thereof.

It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to designate some proper person or persons to make regular collections of the moneys deposited in said meters, and it shall be the duty of such person or persons so designated to remove from the parking meters the coins so deposited in said meters and to deliver said coins or accepted currency to the Treasurer, who shall count the funds contained in such containers and deposit such funds in the usual manner provided by law.

§ 166-73. Parking or standing in on street parking metered zones.

Parking or standing a vehicle in a parking metered space in the parking meter zones described in § 166-65 shall be lawful only when not in excess of the maximum parking time indicated during the hours of operation specified and only upon the deposit of such amount as is prescribed by the following section. Parking for the periods of time indicated in said section shall be permitted only in those areas within the zones where parking is not prohibited or restricted to a shorter period of time by any other duly adopted provision of this chapter regulating the parking of vehicles.

§ 166-73.1. Parking in off-street parking meter zones.

No person shall park at any time upon any area in any metered off-street parking area except within a parking stall controlled by a metering device.

§ 166-74. Schedule XXII: Parking Rates.

The charges for the use of parking metering devices in all zones in the borough shall be as follows:

- A. In parking meter zones with a time limit of twelve (12) minutes or thirty-six (36) minutes, the charge shall be one cent (\$0.01) in the form of one (1) penny for each twelve (12) minutes.
- B. In parking meter zones with a time limit of two (2) hours, the charge shall be one dollar (\$1.00) for each unit [one (1) hour]

1) In Parking Lot Nos. 1, 2, & 6 in parking meter zones with no time limit, the charge shall be seventy five cents (\$0.75) for each unit, one (1) hour

2) In Parking Lot No. 4 in parking meter zones with 2 hour limit, the charge shall be one dollar (\$1.00) for each unit, one (1) hour

3) In Parking Lot No. 7 in parking meter zones with no time limit, the charge shall be fifty cents (\$0.50) for each unit, one (1) hour

4) In all on-street parking metered zones with a time limit of one hundred twenty (120) minutes-and shall have varied costs per hour as dictated by the meter with exception to meters between Mechanic Street and Park Avenue on the north side; Between Hamilton Street and Veterans Memorial on the south side; on High Street from Davenport Street to Grove Street on both side of the roadway which shall be fifty (\$.50) cents per hour. And Division Street between South Street and veterans memorial on the west side which shall be one penny for twelve minutes

166-74.1 Schedule XXII: Parking Rates for Lot 1A

Lot 1A located on 49 W. High Street Block 118, - Lot 8.

Business Permit and Residential Permits shall be made available to the users of Lot 1A as defined above at the following rates: \$720 Annual; \$390 Semi Annually and \$400 quarterly to users of the lot. Said list shall be maintained by the Clerk's Office. The Permit will be valid Monday through Sunday, 24/7 hours. However, occupants shall not store vehicles at said location and shall be able to move on a semi monthly basis for cleaning and maintenance as required.

ARTICLE XVI Off-Street Parking Areas

§ 166-75. Designation of off-street parking areas; time limits.

Off-street parking areas are hereby established as described in § 166-77, and it shall be unlawful to park or stand a vehicle in such areas in excess of the maximum parking time indicated.

§ 166-76. Parking meters and metering devices, use regulations.

In those off-street parking areas designated in § 166-77 where parking metering devices shall be installed, all such areas shall be subject to the provisions of Article XV, Metered Parking, not in conflict with any provisions contained herein.

§ 166-77. Schedule XXIII: Off-street Parking Areas.

[Amended 12-4-1989 by Ord. No. 1075; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134; 11-21-05 by Ord. No. 2205]

A. It shall be unlawful to park or store a vehicle in excess of the time indicated on the parking meter in any metered stall in the off-street parking lots, numbered 1,2,4,6,7, as shown on Sheets A through F and Sheet G [annexed hereto],² included at the end of Chapter 166, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. In parking lot number 7 metered parking is between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

B. Off-street parking areas are established in the locations described below and in accordance with Sheets A through G, 2 included at the end of Chapter 166. It shall be unlawful to park or stand a vehicle in excess of the time indicated for such areas. [Amended 9-8-98 by Ord. No. 2064]

§ 166-78. Parking time limits. [Amended 42087 by Ord. No. 1015(A); 92187 by Ord. No. 1028; 121790 by Ord. No. 1089; 71591 by Ord. No. 1102]

A. Two-hour time limit areas. The parking of vehicles upon or in the following described areas shall be limited to two (2) hours in any one (1) day:

(1) Parking Lot No. 4: as shown on Sheet C, attached to and made part of this chapter.⁸

D. Overnight parking.

(1) Overnight parking is permitted in municipal lots, unless otherwise noted.

E. (Reserved)

F. Parking on school property. [Amended 12-7-87 by Ord. No. 1035]

(1) The following areas shall be designated areas in which no parking shall be permitted from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekdays (Monday through Friday) during which school is in session, except by personnel authorized by the Somerville Board of Education. Parking shall be permitted at all other times which are not specifically prohibited by this chapter.

(2) There shall be no parking in these areas at any time, except by personnel authorized by the Somerville Board of Education, during snowfalls or when snow is predicted:

- (a) The high school faculty parking lot on Davenport Street and Orchard Street.
 - (b) The student high school parking lot on Davenport Street and Orchard Street.
 - (c) The paved parking area entered from Davenport Street immediately adjacent to the gymnasium side of the high school.
 - (d) The Van Derveer School parking lot.
 - (e) The Van Derveer School oval driveway immediately in front of the school.
 - (f) The Van Derveer School paved playground area immediately adjacent to the oval driveway on the right side of the building.
 - (g) The Central Administration paved parking area entered from West Cliff Street adjacent to the side of the middle school.
 - (h) The Central Building No. 2 paved parking lot entered from Davenport Street.
 - (i) The large paved playground area immediately behind the middle school.
- (3) These areas are more particularly described in schematic drawings which are on file in the office of the Borough Clerk.

(4) This section shall be enforced by the Police Department of the borough.

G. Additional no-parking and time-limit areas; penalties for violation. [Added 3-7-88 by Ord. No. 1038]

(1) The following areas shall be designated areas in which no parking shall be permitted from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekdays (Monday through Friday), except by personnel authorized by the Engineer of the Borough of Somerville and any visitors to the Borough Hall or to the Borough Library. Parking shall be permitted at all other times which are not specifically prohibited by this chapter.

(2) Additionally, there shall be no parking in the Borough Hall parking lot at any time, except by personnel authorized by the Borough of Somerville, during snowfalls or when snow is predicted.

(3) There also shall be no parking for longer than fifteen (15) minutes at any one (1) time in the visitors' parking spaces, located at the front door of the Borough Hall. The visitors' parking spaces referred to in this subsection are more particularly described in a schematic drawing which is on file in the office of the Borough Engineer.

(4) There shall be no parking in the Engine Company #1 parking lot or property located at the southeasterly corner of East Main Street and Veterans Memorial Parkway East, except by members of Engine Company #1 and other members of Somerville Fire Department using the fire department facilities at this location. (5) Any person who violates any subsection of this section shall be fined up to forty dollars (\$40.) for the first offense and from zero dollars (\$0.) to one hundred dollars (\$100.) for any subsequent offenses.

§ 166-79. Installation of parking meters and parking metering devices. [Amended 4/20/87 by Ord. No. 1015(A); 9/21/87 by Ord. No. 1028]

The Chief of Police or designee of Parking Utility shall cause parking meters or parking metering devices to be installed immediately adjacent to and in front of each of the individual parking spaces or in clearly identified location within the parking areas designated in § 166-77 of this Article. The Chief of Police shall be responsible for the regulation, control, operation, maintenance and use of such parking meters or parking metering devices.

§ 166-79.1. Free parking in certain lots. [Added 8/2/93 by Ord. No. 1151; amended 5/15/95 by Ord. No. 1195]

The Borough reserves the right to direct the Chief of Police or designee to provide free parking at its discretion.

§ 166-79.2. Holiday parking between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day on Saturday.
The Borough allows for free parking in Parking Lots 1, 2, & 6 on Every Saturday that fall between Thanksgiving Day and New Year's Day

ARTICLE XVII Parking Facilities Open to Public

§ 166-80. Entrances and exits.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-197, no person shall drive a motor vehicle into any parking yard, lot or other such place except by the entrance designated therein, and no person shall go out of said parking yard, lot or other such place except by the exit designated by markings on the pavement or a sign posted at the exit from said lot. No person shall park at any time upon any of the following described entrances or exits:

A. Parking Lot No. 1 (Central):

- (1) Driveway from Main Street, opposite Union Street, to be entrance only.
- (2) Driveway to Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (3) Driveway from Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (4) Driveway from Maple Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (5) Driveway to Maple Street, to be exit and entrance only.

B. Parking Lot No. 2 (Davenport Street lot): metered.

- (1) Driveway to Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (2) Driveway from Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (3) Driveway from North Doughty Avenue, to be exit and entrance only.
- (4) Driveway to North Doughty Avenue, to be exit and entrance only.

C. Parking Lot No. 4 (South Street): metered.

- (1) Driveway to South Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (2) Driveway from South Street, to be exit and entrance only.
- (3) Driveway to Union Street, to be exit and entrance only.

D. Parking Lot No. 6 (Bridge Street): metered.

- (1) Driveway from Bridge Street, to be entrance only.
- (2) Driveway to Maple Street, to be exit only.

E. Parking Lot No. 7 (East High Street): metered and permit. [Added 9-8-98 by Ord. No. 2064]

- (1) Driveway from East High Street, to be entrance only.
- (2) Driveway to East Cliff Street, to be exit only.

ARTICLE XVIII Handicapped Parking

§ 166-81. Handicapped parking areas designated.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof as a handicapped place or zone, unless said person or vehicle has been issued special identification tags or cards by the Division of Motor Vehicles. These areas are more specifically described as follows:

A. Parking Lot No. 1 [three (3) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet A, attached to and made part of this chapter.18 [Amended 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1136]

B. Parking Lot No. 2 [two (2) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet B, attached to and made part of this chapter.18a

C. Parking Lot No. 4 [two (2) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet C, attached to and made part of this chapter.18b

D. Parking Lot No. 6 [two (2) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet D, attached to and made part of this chapter.19

E. Borough Hall driveway [one (1) reserved stall]: beginning at a point in the easterly line of the driveway at the front of the Somerville Municipal Building, said point being distant southerly one hundred seven (107) feet from the southerly curb line of West End Avenue and from said point running southerly fifteen (15) feet therefrom. [Amended 9-3-02 by Ord. No. 2129]

F. The most westerly parking stall located on the southerly side of Franklin Street. [Added 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134]

§ 166-81.1. Restricted parking zones in front of residences occupied by handicapped persons. [Added 111593 by Ord. No. 1158]

A. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.6, the municipality may, by resolution, establish a restricted parking zone in front of a residence occupied by a handicapped person if a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates have been issued for a vehicle owned by the handicapped person, or by another occupant of the residence who is a member of the immediate family of the handicapped person, by the Division of Motor Vehicles pursuant to the provisions of P.L. 1949, c.280 (C. 39:4-204 et seq.), provided such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

B. Such a resolution establishing a restricted parking zone may be approved after a written request has been submitted by a handicapped person or a representative of the handicapped person or representative of organization seeking a handicap parking space on the roadway for such a restricted parking zone and upon a request pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.6, submitting proof of possession of a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plate issued for the benefit of the handicapped person.

C. The restricted parking zones which have been established in accordance with such a request and resolution shall be reviewed on an annual basis to determine that the condition for the establishment of the restricted parking zone still exists.

ARTICLE XIX Permit Parking [Added 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134]

§ 166-82. Permit parking off-street.

A. No vehicle shall be parked in the off-street parking areas designated for permit parking in Lot 5 in Section 166-77, Schedule XXIII during the hours designated, unless:

(1) The vehicle is owned or operated on a regular basis by a resident of properties on Franklin Street, known as Lots 8 through 13, Block 62 of the Tax Map of the Borough of Somerville, and the vehicle has displayed on its dashboard, in such a manner as to be accessible to visible examination by an officer, a current residential parking permit.

(2) The vehicle falls under one (1) of the exceptions to the parking ban.

B. The following vehicles shall be exempt from this parking permit section:

(1) Visitors. A vehicle displaying a current resident parking permit may park in the designated off-street parking areas, provided that the operator of the vehicle is a bona fide guest of one of the residences within the permit parking area. The permit shall be displayed on the dashboard of the vehicle in such a manner as to be clearly visible by an officer enforcing parking regulations.

(2) Contractors, services and delivery vehicles. Contractors, service and delivery vehicles bearing the name and address of a commercial business may park without a permit during the time they are rendering service to a residence with the permit parking area.

(3) Emergency vehicles. Emergency vehicles and public service, telephone and other public utility vehicles may park within the permit parking area during the time they are rendering service or repairs within that area.

C. Administration. Application for parking permits under this section shall be made in writing on forms provided to the Borough Clerk/Administrator and shall be granted under the following terms and conditions:

(1) To persons who are owners of the designated residences, one (1) permanent permit, valid for one (1) year, shall be issued.

D. Violations. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the permit parking provisions of this section for any person to:

(1) Cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in name or operated by such person to be parked in any of the areas designated on the attached Schedule "A", Sheet F, 21 as established as a decal parking zone as herein described unless said vehicle displays a proper and current decal in accordance with this section.

(2) Willfully defraud, misuse or improperly obtain any decal so as the decal is used for a vehicle or person not entitled to use that decal as described under the provision of this section.

E. Penalty.

(1) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of Subsection D(1), as set forth therein shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine of forty dollars (\$40.00).

(2) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with the provisions of Subsection D(2), as set forth therein or who aids or abets any such violation or failure to comply with the section shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days, either or both of those penalties to be imposed by at the discretion of the Court.

ARTICLE XX Parking Deck
[Added 2-2-04 by Ord. No. 2154]

§ 166-83. Applicability of Article XX.

The provisions of this Article XX shall be applicable to the Parking Deck as same is herein defined.

§ 166-84. Definitions.

As used in this Article XX, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

ASSIGNMENT OF OPERATING MANAGEMENT RIGHTS – defining the borough rights to assign the operations management of the parking deck to a private company by entering into a contract/agreement detailing said assignment.

MULTI-SPACE PARKING METERING DEVICE - An electronic meter within the Parking Deck regulating multiple, numbered parking spaces within the public parking area which accepts coin or currency for payment of parking fees and charges for use of a parking space, and which dispenses a printed receipt indicating the numbered parking space and the time for which payment has been made.

NONPUBLIC PARKING AREA - Those parking spaces within the Parking designated on the Parking Plan.

PARKING - The standing or waiting of a vehicle not actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers or merchandise, unless in obedience to traffic regulations, signs or signals.

PARKING DECK - The parking garage structure located at 59 Veterans Memorial Drive East, Block 63, Lot 32.02 on the tax map.

PARKING SPACE - A space designated for the parking of a single vehicle by lines painted or durably marked on the floor of the Parking Deck.

PUBLIC PARKING AREA - Those parking spaces within the Parking Deck designated on the Parking Plan.

§ 166-85. Designation of parking areas; location of meter.

Off-street public parking in parking spaces as designated on the Parking Plan is hereby established. A multi-space parking meter shall be located as designated in the parking plan.

§ 166-86. Parking within marked parking spaces.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle: (a), in any portion of the Parking Deck which is not marked as a parking space; and/or (b), across any line or marking of a parking space or in such position that the vehicle shall not be entirely within the area marked as a parking space.

§ 166-87. Metered or permit parking allowed in public parking area.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in a parking space in the public parking area between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Monday through Saturday unless: (a), a valid Parking Deck permit for public parking shall be prominently displayed so that same shall be visible through the front windshield; or (b), payment of the parking fee or charge for use of the numbered parking space for the period of time the vehicle shall occupy such parking space shall be made by deposit of the proper coin or currency in the multi-space parking metering device.

§ 166-88. No parking certain hours.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in a parking space in the public parking area between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. on any day unless a valid Parking Deck permit for public parking shall be prominently displayed so that same shall be visible through the front windshield.

§ 166-89. No entry certain hours.

It shall be unlawful to enter the Parking Deck with a vehicle between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. unless a valid Parking Deck permit for public parking shall be prominently displayed so that same shall be visible through the front windshield.

§ 166-90. Permit required; nonpublic parking area.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in a parking space in the nonpublic parking area at any time unless there shall be prominently displayed in or on the vehicle

§ 166-91. Driving within Parking Deck.

- A. It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle within the Parking Deck in a manner inconsistent with any directional signs or signals regulating the flow of traffic.
- B. It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle which exceeds eight (8) feet four (4) inches in height on any level of the Parking Deck.
- C. It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle which exceeds seven (7) feet and no (0) inches in height other than on the ground level of the Parking Deck.

§ 166-92. Speed limit.

It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle within the Parking Deck at a speed in excess of eight (8) miles per hour.

§ 166-93. Damage to multispace parking metering device.

It shall be unlawful to deface, injure, tamper with, open, or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness or operability of the multi-space parking metering device within the Parking Deck.

§ 166-94. Only valid coins or currency permitted.

- A. It shall be unlawful to deposit, insert or place any object or tangible thing other than valid United States coins or currency in the multi-space parking metering device within the Parking Deck.
- B. It shall be unlawful willfully to defraud, misuse or improperly obtain any parking permit provided for under this Article XX.

§ 166-95. Parking rates.

- A. The hourly fee or charge for parking within the public parking area of the Parking Deck shall be defined annually by ordinance under parking fee schedules.

§ 166-96. Temporary suspension of regulations.

The Mayor and Council by resolution, and/or the Chief of Police by order, may, for special reasons or occasions, or in the event of emergency, temporarily suspend any provisions contained in this Article XX regulating the nature and time for use of the Parking Deck, spaces available for use, and parking fees and charges.

§ 166-97. Reports of violations; citations.

- A. It shall be the duty of any police or parking enforcement officer, acting in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief of Police, to report:

- (1) The number of the parking space in which a vehicle is parked in violation of this Article XX;
- (2) A description of the area in which a vehicle is parked in violation of this Article XX, if other than in a numbered space;
- (3) The state license number of such vehicle;
- (4) The provision of this Article XX of which the vehicle is in violation.

B. The police or parking enforcement officer shall attach to any such vehicle a notice to the owner thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of the cited provision of this Article XX and instructing the owner to report to the Municipal Court in regard to such violation.

§ 166-98. Impounding of vehicles.

Any vehicle parked in violation of Sections 166-86, 166-87, 166-88, or 166-90 shall be subject to being towed, under the direction of the Police Department, to a garage or other place designated by the Chief of Police for impoundment, subject to redemption by the owner upon payment of the reasonable cost of towing and storage for each day or portion thereof during which it remains in said garage or other place.

§ 166-99. Use of Parking Deck.

No person shall utilize the Parking Deck or any portion thereof for recreation, sport, amusement, entertainment or other use not directly related to the parking of motor vehicles.

§ 166-100. Fines and penalties.

- A. Any violation of Sections 166-86 through 166-92 shall be punishable by a fine of forty dollars (\$40.) per violation, provided, however, any person convicted of a subsequent violation of the same section within one (1) year shall, in the discretion of the court, be subject to the enhanced fine authorized by N.J.S.A. 40:49-5.
- B. Any person convicted of a violation of Section 166-93 or Section 166-94 shall be subject to a minimum fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.) and a maximum fine of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.), and such additional penalties as are provided in Section 1-15 of the Code of the Borough of Somerville.
- C. Any person convicted of a violation of Section 166-99 shall be subject to a maximum fine of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.), and such additional penalties as are provided in Section 1-15 of the Code of the Borough of Somerville.






Zone 1 - 2 hour limit



Zone 2 – Off Street




Zone 2 Off Street


PO Zone 30 Minute Limit





ORDINANCE #2508-16-1003

AMENDING CHAPTER 80 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED FIRE PREVENTION; ADDING NEW SECTION ENTITLED CERTIFICATE OF SMOKE DETECTOR, CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM AND FIRE EXTINGUISHER COMPLIANCE AND REPEALING ARTICLE III SMOKE DETECTORS IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REFORMATTING CHAPTER 80

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset and State of New Jersey, hereby adopts and amends Chapter 80 of the Borough Code and. shall be shall read as follows:

Sec. 80-1 Fire Prevention.

- a. Local Enforcement. Pursuant to Section 11 of the Uniform Safety Act, P.L. 1983, c. 383 of the Laws of the State of New Jersey, the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code shall be enforced locally in the Borough of Somerville, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 42:27D-192 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 5:70-1 et seq.
- b. Definition of Local Enforcing Agency. The local enforcing agency shall be the Bureau of Fire Prevention in the Somerville Fire Department and shall be comprised of the Fire Marshal, Fire Inspectors and such clerical staff as needed to carry out the responsibilities of the agency.
- c. Powers and Duties. The Bureau shall enforce the Uniform Fire Safety Act, Codes and regulations adopted for all buildings, structures and premises within the established boundaries of the Borough of Somerville and shall faithfully comply with the requirements of the Uniform Fire Safety Act and the Uniform Fire Code.
- d. Life Hazard Uses. The Bureau shall carry out the periodic inspections of life-hazard uses required by the Uniform Fire Code on behalf of the New Jersey Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs.
- e. Organization. The Bureau shall be under the direct supervision and control of the Fire Marshal of the Borough of Somerville. Fire Inspectors shall report to the Fire Marshal. The Fire Marshal shall report to the Borough Administrator.
- f. Powers and Duties of Fire Marshal. In addition to the duties set forth in Uniform Fire Safety Act P.L. 1983, c. 383 of the Laws of the State of New Jersey and Uniform Fire Code, the Fire Marshal shall:
 - 1. Recommend to the Borough Administrator and Board of Engineers such amendments to the Code as deemed necessary to provide fire safety.
- g. Additional required inspection and fees. In addition to the inspections or fees required pursuant to the Uniform Fire Safety Act and the regulations of the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, the following additional inspections and fees shall be required.
 - 1. Inspections.

Except for one- and two-family owner-occupied dwellings used exclusively for dwelling purposes, the Bureau shall inspect all buildings, businesses, structures or premises to ascertain and cause to be corrected any conditions liable to cause fire, contribute to the spread of fire, interfere with firefighter operations, endanger life or any conditions constituting violations of the provisions of intent of this

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Chapter or other fire or life safety requirements. Upon completion of such inspection, and the abatement of violations, the bureau shall issue to the owner or occupant of the building, structure or premises, a fire safety certificate of compliance.

2. Registration and Fees.

The owner(s) of all buildings, businesses, structures or premises required to be inspected under subparagraph 1 shall register with the Bureau of Fire Prevention annually. Such registration shall be made on forms provided by the bureau. It shall be a violation of this code for an owner to fail to return such forms within thirty (30) days of issuance. Every property owner that is required to file a registration statement shall file an amended registration within seven (7) days after the occurrence of any change which would render any information contained in a registration statement inaccurate. With the exception of life hazard uses registered pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:70, registrations shall be accompanied by fees in accordance with the following:

- Class I. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises 200 sq./ft. or less shall be twenty five (\$25.00) dollars.
- Class II. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises greater than 200 sq./ft. but equal to or less than 400 sq./ft. shall be fifty (\$50.00) dollars.
- Class III. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises more than 400 sq./ft. but equal to or less than 1,000 sq./ft. shall be seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars.
- Class IV. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises more than 1,000 sq./ft. but equal to or less than 2,500 sq./ft. shall be one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.
- Class V. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises more than 2,500 sq./ft. but equal to or less than 5,000 sq./ft. shall be one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars.
- Class VI. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises more than 5,000 sq./ft. but less than or equal to 12,000 sq/ft shall be two hundred (\$200.00) dollars.
- Class VII. Non-life hazard registration for businesses, buildings, structures or premises more than 12,000 sq/ft shall be two hundred seventy five (\$275.00) dollars.
- Class VIII. Eating and drinking establishments with less than fifty (50) occupants in which no alcoholic beverages are consumed shall be one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.
- Class IX. Multiple Dwellings and commercial and industrial buildings, businesses, structures or premises with common areas accessible to the tenants or the public shall be one hundred (\$100.00) dollars per building.

3. Waivers.

The following users shall be exempt from the local permit and registration fees:

- i. The Somerville Fire Department

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- ii. The Somerville Rescue Squad
- iii. Places of Worship. This shall apply to uses where the actual religious service takes place, uses for religious education purposes or uses of an occasional nature.
- iv. Contractors and construction firms, when the activity is part of work performed under a valid permit issued by the Building Department.
- v. Borough of Somerville.
- vi. Somerville Board of Education.
- vii. County of Somerset

4. Special Events.

When determined by the Fire Marshal to be necessary for the purpose of public safety to have a Fire Inspector present during special events, the owner, operator, organizer, sponsor, person, or organization responsible, for said event shall pay the cost of said inspector at the rate of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars per hour for the duration of the event.

5. Fire Watch.

If the Fire Marshal, Fire Inspector, paid personnel or member of a volunteer fire company is required to inspect, monitor, or patrol a building to detect circumstances that might immediately result in a fire while a building's fire protection system is inoperative, the owner of said building shall pay the Borough of Somerville two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per day and reimburse the Borough for said fire watch services at the rate designated in the salary ordinance per hour and for equipment as designated by the Schedule of Fire Service fees. There shall be a minimum fee of two hundred (\$200.00) dollars, provided that no fee shall be assessed if within thirty (30) minutes of being notified of the commencement of the fire watch services, the building owner or his or her representative arrives at the building and assumes control of the fire watch from the Fire Marshal, Fire Inspector, paid personnel or member of the volunteer fire company, however any fees paid by the Borough of Somerville shall be reimbursed. The cost of providing fire watch services shall be certified by the Fire Marshal to the building owner within ten (10) days of their completion. The building owner shall reimburse the Borough within thirty (30) days thereof.

h. Certificate of smoke detector, carbon monoxide alarm and fire extinguisher compliance (CSDCMAFEC).

- 1. Before any one or two family structure is sold for residential purposes, the owner shall obtain a certificate of smoke detector, carbon monoxide alarm and fire extinguisher compliance (CSDCMAFEC) evidencing compliance with N.J.A.C. 5:70-4.19, 5:70-2.3, 5:70-3 and N.J.S.A. 52:27D-198.1
- 2. The owner or the authorized agent of the owner shall apply for a CSDCMAFEC on a form provided by the Somerville Bureau of Fire Prevention. The application shall be accompanied by the required fee as outlined below:
 - i. Request for a CSDCMAC received more than 10 business days prior to the change of occupant: \$75.
 - ii. Request for a CSDCMAC received four business days to 10 business days prior to the change of occupant: \$100.
 - iii. Request for a CSDCMAC received fewer than four business days prior to the change of occupant: \$125.

i. Permits and Fees.

1. Trade shows, craft shows, exhibits, expositions, auctions, art sales, concerts, wrestling matches, festivals, dinners, dances, balls and similar events including non-school type uses in school buildings, cultural centers and convention centers and any other uses requiring inspection by the Fire Marshal or Fire Inspector shall be one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars per event.
2. Asphalt (tar) kettles per job site shall be sixty (\$60.00) dollars.
3. Permit application fees established by the Uniform Fire Code N.J.AC. 5-70-2.9 are as follows:
 - Type I – fifty (\$50.00) dollars
 - Type II – one hundred seventy five (\$175.00) dollars
 - Type III – three hundred fifty (\$350.00) dollars
 - Type IV – five hundred (\$500.00) dollars

j. Fire Alarms and Reporting.

1. The Fire Marshal or his or her designee shall investigate, or cause to be investigated, the activation of any fire alarm, fire detector or fire protection system occurring within the Borough. The Fire Marshal or his or designee shall determine the cause for such activation and determine whether the alarm, detector or protection system has been properly restored to full service.
2. Failure to report: It shall be a violation of this section for any person or persons, having knowledge of same, to fail to immediately report to the Somerville Fire Department: the activation of any fire protection system or device; the occurrence of any fire; any attempted arson; or the spill or leakage of any flammable or combustible liquid or gas or of any hazardous material.

k. Board of Appeals.

Pursuant to Sections 15 and 17 of the Uniform Safety Act, P.L. 1983, c. 383 of the Laws of the State of New Jersey, any person aggrieved by any order of the bureau shall have the right to appeal to the Construction Board of Appeals of the County of Somerset.

l. Fire Lanes and Fire Zones.

1. Designation of Fire Lanes and Fire Zones
 - i. Certain areas shall be designated as fire lanes to provide clear access to buildings for the fire-fighting equipment in the event of an emergency call, fire hydrants and water connection devices located on Borough and private roads shall be designated as fire zones as permitted by N.J.S.A. 39:4-8 et seq.
2. Notice to Affected Property Owners
 - i. The bureau shall send to the property owner by personal delivery or certified mail all notices requiring the installation of signs or the painting of fire-lane or fire-zone lines on said property owner's property.
 - ii. Any property owner so noticed shall install the required signs and paint the required lines within thirty (30) days of receipt of said notice.
3. Intervention by the Borough for Failure to Comply. If a property owner fails to comply with the requirements of this paragraph, the bureau may cause the required signs to be installed and the lines painted at the property owner's expense. Said costs shall be assessed against the affect property and collected through the Borough Somerville Tax Collector's Office.

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4. **Parking, Stopping or Standing of Vehicles Prohibited.** No person shall park ("parking" means the standing or waiting on a street, road or highway of a vehicle not actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers or merchandise, unless in obedience to traffic regulations or traffic signs or signals), stop or leave standing ("stopping" or "standing" means any cessation of movement of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control sign or signal) any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, in any designated twenty (20') feet wide fire lane or fire zone or obstruct any designated fire lane or fire zone. No person shall park, stop or leave standing any vehicle within fifteen (15') feet of any fire hydrant or other fire department water connection device.
5. **Restrictions for Loading Zones.** In loading zones designated herein, attended vehicles may stop solely for the purpose of loading or unloading and only for the period of time necessary to accomplish such loading or unloading.
6. **Installation of Signs, Painting of Lines.**
 - i. **Markings.** The owner shall, within thirty (30) days of being given notice to do so by the Fire Marshal, mark the lanes as follows:
 - (a) Signs, with minimum dimensions of twelve inches by eighteen (12" x 18") inches constructed of metal with raised red letters a minimum of two (2") inches in size on a white background shall be posted at a level of at least seven (7') feet above grade indicating "NO PARKING AT ANYTIME". Immediately under these signs shall be another sign, with minimum dimensions of twelve inches by six (12" x 6") inches saying "FIRE LANE" OR "FIRE LANE NO ON STREET-PARKING". Spacing of signs shall be even with a minimum of one (1) sign for every fifty (50') feet of fire lane or part thereof, or as ordered by the Fire Marshal. All signs and markings must be unobstructed and visible for a distance of at least one hundred (100') feet when viewed from a position approximately five (5') feet above the ground while in the fire lane.
 - ii. Diagonal yellow lines shall be painted on the pavement along the length of the fire lane or fire zone where possible. Fire lanes shall have a minimum width of twenty (20') feet.
 - iii. Fire zones associated with fire hydrants and water connection devices shall be identified with yellow paint extending fifteen (15') feet in both directions on the curb and/or pavement where possible.
7. **Enforcement Agencies for the Parking in Fire Lanes or Fire Zones.** The bureau and the Somerville Police Department shall have concurrent jurisdiction in policing and issuing parking summons.
8. **Penalties.**
 - i. Property owners failing to install signs or paint pavement within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice shall be subject to a fine not to exceed five hundred (\$500.00) dollars in accordance with the requirements of the Uniform Fire Code.
 - ii. Violators who park illegally in a fire lane or fire zone shall be subject to a fine of seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars. Said fine shall be imposed on complaint and conviction in the municipal court of the Borough of Somerville.

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- iii. All fines and penalties shall be paid to the Borough of Somerville Treasury.

m. Key Box Requirements.

1. All buildings or structures protected by fire alarms shall be provided with a key box approved by the Fire Marshal. The key box shall contain keys to provide access to all areas of the building or structure and shall be installed in a location approved by the Fire Marshal; such key box shall only be utilized in response to a report of a fire or fire protection system activation or other emergency call.
 - i. The key box shall be located in a lighted location not higher than five and a half (5-1/2') feet above grade and shall be provided with a monitor tamper switch.
 - ii. Key boxes shall be installed within ninety (90) days of receiving a notice from the Fire Marshal.
 - iii. Key box keys shall be issued to the Fire Marshal. Each individual receiving keys shall be responsible for the security of same at all times.
 - iv. Buildings or structures occupied twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days per week, by personnel processing keys to all areas and residential occupancies, and financial institutions shall be exempt from the requirements of this subsection provided, however, that residential complexes containing locked common areas and/or master key capabilities shall be provided with a key box.
2. All buildings or structures that have an elevator equipped with an elevator recall shall provide the elevator recall key in a key box installed in a location readily accessible to the fire department.

n. Penalties.

1. Any person or persons who violates any provision of the subsection is subject to municipal summons of not less than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars nor more than one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars.
2. Failure to file a registration application pursuant to subsection 2-13.5(g) shall subject the person(s) responsible for said payment to a penalty in the amount equal to double the registration fee, but not less than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars or more than one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars.
3. Failure to pay the required registration fees shall subject the person(s) responsible for said payment to a penalty in the amount equal to the unpaid fee. Payment of the fee after imposition of the penalty shall not absolve the owner from responsibility for the penalty nor shall payment of the penalty be deemed to absolve the owner from the obligation to pay the fee.

This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication in accordance with applicable law.
