Somerville, NJ August 17, 2015

The second regular meeting of the Somerville Borough Council for the Month of August 2015 was convened on Monday, August 17, 2015 at 7:00 pm prevailing time in Borough Council Chambers 24 South Bridge Street, Somerville, New Jersey.

Clerk-Administrator Sluka read the open public meeting statement and advised that the meeting was properly noticed in the newspaper and at Borough Hall.

Upon call of the roll, the following Borough Council members were present: Mayor Brian Gallagher Presiding, Council President Jane Kobuta, Councilman Jason Kraska, Councilman Thompson Mitchell, Councilman Dennis Sullivan, and Councilman Ken Utter, and Councilman Robert Wilson.

Also present was Borough Clerk-Administrator Kevin Sluka and Borough Attorney Jeremy Solomon.

The pledge of allegiance was led by Nick Fabiano.

Mayor Gallagher recognized Nick Fabiano with a Proclamation. Nick will be entering the United States Navy in September. Mayor Gallagher outlined the community service that Nick Fabiano has done in his service to the Borough as a member of the Somerville Rescue Squad and also a member of the Somerville Fire Department. He thanked Nick for his commitment and service to the Borough of Somerville as well as his parents for their support throughout the years.

The minutes of the July 20, 2015 meeting were presented in writing for approval.

Councilman Utter made a motion and was seconded Councilwoman Kobuta to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was approved by the following vote:

Carried unanimously

Councilman Wilson abstained due to his absence

Discussion:

a. Fire Museum update:

Rich O'Neill, Chairman of the Somerville Fire Museum provided the Council with a comprehensive update on the activities to date on the Fire Museum. He provided some video segments which outlined the ribbon cutting last October, the school tours that were conducted for all second grade classes and also a thank you video which was created by the 2nd grade students at Van Derveer School. There were a total of 144 students who participated in the tours of the fire museum and the police department.

Joelle Kessler, 2nd grade teacher outlined the tour program and the efforts of the Fire Department. She also explained the community awareness program and how it really impacted the students.

Rich also wished to thank the countless volunteers who have really worked hard to make the fire museum a success. There is still much more to go and he is excited as what is yet to come. He asked the members of the department that participated in the tours to stand up and be recognized.

The committee presented Mayor Gallagher with the axe that was used for the Grand Opening last year.

Rich then provided a brief overview of the fire museum from its early days as the original West End Hose Fire House.

Councilman Utter commented that this makes history come alive for the kids.

Mayor Gallagher again thanked everyone involved in this effort and pledged his continued support.

b. Somerville First Aid Squad update

Steve Weinman and Jim Barry of the Somerville Rescue Squad provided a mid-year report on the year to date activities in the squad.

There were a total of 1242 EMS calls through July 31, 2015. The squad is strong with a total of 8 night crews.

The paid day-time crew trial partnership with Hillsborough Emergency Medical Services for the past year is working out well. There were a total of 771 daytime calls for service. Of those calls there 539 were transports. There were a total a 468 billable calls. This relates to only 60% of the calls were billable EMS calls. This generated enough revenue to cover the salaries and expenses to cover the costs of daytime EMS service there were a total of 9 mutual aid calls which was an all-time record low for the squad.

Councilman Utter reminded everyone the donations for the squad are still needed to maintain the 24 hour operations of the squad.

Mayor Gallagher also commended the squad for their operations and also their volunteer commitment to Somerville.

c. Fire Department Action Plan

Chief Bob Lynn and Deputy Chief Greg Sorace provided an update on the current status and future of the Somerville Fire Department. They presented a copy of a comprehensive plan to the Mayor and Council for their review. To date there have been 266 fire calls. In addition there are some other high risk areas in town such as the RWJ- Medical Center, Somerset County Government Facilities, and Senior Citizen High-Rise.

Chief Lynn outlined the existing structures and the needs for the future. A number of these fire department facilities no longer meet NFPA standards. He outlined the current apparatus, protective equipment and other fire-fighting equipment.

Currently the fire department is getting by with daytime coverage. He commented that they are looking at the possible use of DPW employees for additional daytime coverage.

Chief Lynn outlined the current recruitment program as well as the Junior Fire program.

Chief Lynn discussed the current LOSAP program.

The current fire department budget is \$142,000 per year.

Mayor Gallagher commented on the excellent report. He also commented on the training requirements both initial and refresher training that needs to take place each year.

Mayor Gallagher commented that there is an active facilities committee in place that is looking at the future facility needs of the Somerville Fire Department.

Councilman Utter commented that this is an excellent report which will be used by the facility planning committee who has been meeting and working hard over the past couple of meetings.

Councilman Mitchell asked that the Borough Property Committee be kept informed as to the status of the future needs.

Councilman Wilson also commended the department and officers for their efforts. He noted some of the thank you letters that were sent by the Van Derveer students to the firemen. There is a need by this Council to provide suitable facilities and equipment.

At this time, Mayor Gallagher adjourned the meeting for five minutes in order for the Fire Department members to exit the room.

Councilman Sullivan commented on the recent number of Verizon invoices.

Paul Allena, Technology Coordinator responded that there was a current phone audit underway to reduce the annual costs.

Councilman Kraska reported that the Borough Pools will be closing on Friday, August 21, 2015. The Spay Park will be open until September 20, 2015.

Councilman Kraska reported the pools will be in need of repairs over the coming months.

Councilman Kraska noted some roadway repairs that have been completed.

Councilman Mitchell commented on a personnel issue. Mayor Gallagher asked that this be handled in Executive Session.

Councilman Mitchell reported that Environmental Commission has recently toured the Van Fleet and Carol Pager parks. They have come up with fourteen recommendations to improvements for these park areas.

Councilman Utter reported a total of 204 EMS calls for the month of July 2015.

Councilman Utter reported that the Somerville Fire Department will lead the 2015 Firemen's Parade in Wildwood in tribute to Barry Van Horn.

Councilman Utter reported that Yesterkades on Division Street will be starting their roof replacement project soon.

Councilman Utter reported on the 2015 Downtown Somerville Jazz Festival on Sunday, September 20, 2015.

Councilwoman Kobuta commented on a letter commending Mary Ann Reh in Vital Statistics.

Councilman Kraska reported on the upcoming improvements to Carol Pager Park.

Open to the Public:

Lori Rosen, 4 South Richards Ave, Somerville, commented on a situation of smoking in public during the Wednesday night movies on Division Street. She presented a petition from concerned residents.

Don Tozzi, Basilone Memorial Foundation, provided an overview of the Foundation and some of the upcoming events that are being planned by the Foundation.

He thanked the Mayor and Council for their continued support with this organization.

Ms. Sara DeJesus, 6 Sommer Dr, Somerville, commented on the early closing of the Borough Pools.

Mayor Gallagher replied that there is an issue with staffing the pools with Life Guards. Most of the life guards are college students who are in the process of returning to college for their fall semester.

Ms. DeJesus also asked on the status of the surface at the spray park.

Councilman Kraska reported that this will be addressed after the spray park closes in September.

Fred Weid, 25 Somerset Street, Somerville, asked about the space on the sidewalks on where restaurants are placing tables.

Mayor Gallagher replied that there is an ordinance which regulates this. This issue becomes more apparent on Friday evenings.

Herb Hall, 22 Fairmount Ave, Somerville, commented that he appreciated the recent Loeser Ave. repairs.

Mr. Hall asked the status on the crack sealing machine.

Clerk-Administrator Sluka reported that this capital equipment is on the agenda this evening.

Mr. Hall asked what part of the Open Public Meetings resolution the Borough is in opposition to.

Kevin Sluka responded that this legislation would require additional resources to be used for every additional committee in addition to the Borough Council and Planning Board which are already public meetings.

Mr. Hall again voiced her concern about the article in the newspaper regarding turning the post office into a cultural center.

Mayor Gallagher replied that the Borough would be very interested in any future changes to the use of the current post office.

Russel Jones, 96 Southside Ave, Somerville, asked for consideration for traffic improvements in the intersection of Hamilton Street and Southside Ave.

Mayor Gallagher replied that there are some additional traffic calming measures being installed in this area through a grant from the Regional Center Partnership.

There were no further comments and the public session was closed.

Ordinances for Introduction:

ORDINANCE# 2476-15-0817

AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL LAND USE CODE CHAPTER 102, SECTION 118 ENTITLED OFF STREET PARKING AND LOADING REQUIREMENTS – SUBSECTION F- (4) ENTITLED DRIVEWAYS

WHEREAS, Chapter 102-117 F-(4) shall be amended as follows

“No driveway used or intended to be used for a single family detached or two family dwelling shall have a width within the front yard exceeding one-fifth (1/5) of the width of the lot for which the driveway provides access, provided, however, that where otherwise lawful, no driveway shall exceed the width of twenty-five (25) feet, with the exception of Tax Map 9.03, which allows aprons and driveways to be a maximum of eighteen (18) feet in width. On corner lots through lots, the lot width used for making the above calculation shall be that side of the lot through which the driveway provides access to the street. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a driveway shall be permitted to exceed the total width of functional garage door(s) by up to nine (9) feet, but only for a distance of twenty (20) feet in front of such garage door(s)”.

This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication in accordance with applicable law.

Mayor Gallagher provided an overview of the Ordinance. There are issues with the current zoning Ordinance as it relates to 2 lane driveways in the Fieldstone Drive area. There are 120 homes in this subdivision which would be effected by this Ordinance.

Mayor Gallagher opened the meeting for comments on Ordinance 2476-15-0817

There were no comments and the public portion was closed.

Councilman Utter made a motion and was seconded Councilwoman Kobuta to introduce Ordinance 2476-15-0817.

Councilman Sullivan commented that he feels that these driveways have been added as a result of additional home renovations that were done which have eliminated the use of the garage. He has a concern with the additional blacktop and possible water run-off.

Mayor Gallagher commented that this ordinance will allow an existing condition in the neighborhood to be brought into the proper zoning ordinance.

Councilman Wilson asked for clarification on what the extent of the changes area.

Michael Cole, Borough Planner explained that the intent of the change will be allow the homeowner to widen their driveway apron to 18” feet in order to allow for two car lengths to enter the driveway.

ARTICLE I General Provisions

§ 166-1. Definitions.

Whenever any words or phrases are used in this chapter, the meanings respectively ascribed to them in Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey shall be deemed to apply to such words and phrases used herein.

§ 166-2. Repealer.

All former ordinances of the Borough of Somerville are hereby repealed, except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or committed in violation of any ordinance hereby repealed prior to the taking effect of this chapter.

§ 166-3. Severability.

If any part or parts of this chapter are held to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this chapter.

§ 166-4. Violations and penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey statute, or except as specifically provided in some other section of this chapter, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this chapter or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or both.

ARTICLE II Parking

§ 166-5. Regulations not exclusive.

The provisions of this Article imposing a time limit on parking shall not relieve any person of the duty to observe other and more restrictive provisions prohibiting or limiting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles as set forth in N.J.R.S. 39:4-138, any other New Jersey statute or as hereinafter provided.

§ 166-6. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule I, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-7. Parking prohibited during certain hours.

A. No person shall park a vehicle between the hours specified in Schedule II of any day upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule II, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

B. No truck over four (4) tons shall be parked on any street between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., including Sundays and holidays.

§ 166-8. Stopping and standing prohibited.

No person shall stop or stand a vehicle during the time specified in Schedule III, of any day, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule III, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-9. Parking time limited.

No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit shown in Schedule IV at any time between the hours listed in said Schedule IV, of any day, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule IV, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-10. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule V, attached to and made a part of this chapter, except at the angle designated and only within the painted white stall lines.

§ 166-10.1. Permit parking. [Added 10587 by Ord. No. 1030]

- A. [Amended 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134; 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114] No vehicle shall be parked on the streets or parts of streets designated in Schedule VA and Schedule VB, attached hereto and made a part of this chapter, during the hours designated in the schedule, Monday through Friday, unless:
- (1) The vehicle is owned or operated on a regular basis by a resident of that street and the vehicle has displayed on its left rear window, in such a manner as to be accessible to visible examination by an officer, a current residential parking permit.
 - (2) The vehicle falls under one (1) of the exceptions to the parking ban.
- B. The following vehicles shall be exempt from this parking permit section:
- (1) Visitors. A vehicle displaying a current visitor parking permit may park on any of the controlled streets described on Schedule VA and Schedule VB, provided that the operator of the vehicle is a bona fide guest of the residence within the permit parking area. The visitor's permit shall be displayed on the dashboard of the vehicle in such a manner as to be clearly visible by an officer enforcing parking regulations. [Amended 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134; 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114]
 - (2) Contractors, service and delivery vehicles. Contractors, service and delivery vehicles bearing the name and address of a commercial business may park without a permit during the time they are rendering service to a residence within the permit parking area.
 - (3) Emergency vehicles. Emergency vehicles and public service, telephone and other public utility vehicles may park within the permit parking area during the time they are rendering service or repairs within that area.
 - (4) Parking of vehicles as exempted in Section 166-46.2. [Added 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114]
- C. Administration. Application for parking permits under this section shall be made in writing on forms provided to the Borough Clerk-Administrator or his designee. Permits shall be granted by the Clerk-Administrator under the following terms and conditions:
- (1) To persons who are residents on said street or portion thereof upon which parking is restricted by this section, a permanent permit, valid for one (1) year, shall be issued for every vehicle owned or principally operated by such person. There shall be no limit on the number of permits which may be issued to any one (1) household. In the event a structure on said street or portion thereof upon which parking is restricted by this section shall contain a nonresidential use, then said nonresidential use shall be limited to two (2) permits. [Amended 9-19-94 by Ord. No. 1181]
 - (2) Two (2) visitor permits shall be issued to each residential unit on any street or portion thereof upon which parking is restricted by this section for use only by visitors to that residential unit.
- D. Violations. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this section for any person to:
- (1) Cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in his name or operated by such person to be parked in any of the areas designated on the attached Schedule VA and Schedule VB as established as a decal parking zone as herein described unless said vehicle displays a proper and

current decal in accordance with this section. [Amended 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134; 10-1-01 by Ord. No. 2114]

(2) Willfully defraud, misuse or improperly obtain any decal so as the decal is used for a vehicle or person not entitled to use that decal as described under the provision of this section.

E. Penalty.

(1) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of Subsection D(1) as set forth therein shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine of ten dollars (\$10.). This fine shall be increased by the sum of one dollar (\$1.) per violation with such other sum as may be charged by the State of New Jersey for the Automated Traffic System and this increased fine shall continue for so long as this cost is imposed by the State of New Jersey upon the Borough of Somerville. [Amended 7-6-92 by Ord. No. 1123]

(2) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with the provisions of Subsection D(2) as set forth therein or who aids or abets any such violation or failure to comply with that subsection shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days, either or both of those penalties to be imposed at the discretion of the court.

§ 166-10.2. Emergency no parking. [Added 3-7-88 by Ord. No. 1037; amended 9-6-94 by Ord. No. 1182]

- A. Parking of any vehicle on any portion of a borough public road, street or highway is prohibited whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that the road, street or highway is snow covered, an emergency shall exist and no vehicle shall be parked on the following streets or highways or portions thereof, all municipality owned streets or highways.
- B. The above parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic, to be determined by the Office of Emergency Management. [Amended 3-3-14 by Ord. No. 2431]
- C. As used in this chapter, the term snow covered shall mean any precipitation depositing any accumulation on the streets, roads or highways, including snow, sleet, hail, ice or freezing rain, which requires plowing, salting or sanding.
- D. As to Subsection A of this section, regulatory and warning signs in accordance with N.J.S.A. 39:4-198 shall be erected and maintained at all street, road or highway entrances for motor vehicles into this municipality.
- E. During extreme weather conditions when a vehicle is not able to proceed and must be parked on any street, road or highway in the borough, the operator of such vehicle must, by the quickest means of communication, notify the Department of Public Works of the Borough of Somerville of such vehicle.
- F. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this section shall be deemed a nuisance and menace to the safe and proper regulations of traffic and any police officer may provide for removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of removal and storage which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.
- G. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this section shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding sixty dollars (\$60.). [Amended 3-3-14 by Ord. No. 2431]
- H. Upon the declaration of an emergency there shall be no parking upon any public road, street or highway or portion thereof in the Borough of Somerville where either a permanent or temporary EMERGENCY NO PARKING sign is displayed. The Mayor of the Borough of Somerville, or his duly appointed representative, with advice from the Borough Engineer, Chief of Police and the Fire Chief, is authorized to declare such emergency and to direct the posting of temporary EMERGENCY NO PARKING signs when, in his judgment, weather conditions, accident, fire, public celebration or other similar emergency requires the avoidance of hazards or other conditions which interfere with the free flow of traffic. Notification that EMERGENCY NO PARKING signs are being or will be posted shall be given to the operator or owner of any vehicle which has been parked prior to the posting of said signs. Placing written advice of such posting on or in such a parked vehicle shall be deemed sufficient notification hereunder.

ARTICLE III Truck Exclusions

§ 166-11. Truck over four tons excluded.

Trucks over four (4) tons' gross weight are hereby excluded from the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VI, except for the pickup and delivery of materials on such streets, said Schedule VI being attached to and made a part of this chapter [NOTE: The minimum weight limit permitted pursuant to N.J.R.S. 40:67.16.1 is four (4) tons.]

ARTICLE IV One-Way Streets

§ 166-12. One way streets designated.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated.

ARTICLE V Stop and Yield Intersections

§ 166-13. Through streets designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-140, the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VIII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as through streets. Stop signs shall be installed on the near right side of each street intersecting the through street except where yield signs are provided for in the designations.

§ 166-14. Stop intersections designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-140, the intersections described in Schedule IX, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as stop intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided therein.

§ 166-15. Yield intersections designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-140, the intersections described in Schedule X, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as yield intersections. Yield signs shall be installed as provided therein.

ARTICLE VI Special Zones and Areas

§ 166-16. Loading zones designated.

The locations described in Schedule XI, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as loading zones.

§ 166-17. Taxi stands designated.

The locations described in Schedule XII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as taxi stands.

§ 166-18. Bus stops designated; midblock crosswalks.

- A. Bus stops designated. The locations described in Schedule XIII A, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as bus stops.
- B. Midblock crosswalks. The locations described in Schedule XIII B, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as midblock crosswalks.

ARTICLE VII Turn Prohibitions

§ 166-19. U-turns.

No person shall make a U-turn on any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XIV, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-20. Turns at intersections.

No person shall make a turn of the kind designated (left, right, all) at any of the locations described in Schedule XV, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-21. Right and left turn lane reservations.

Lanes for right- or left-hand turns only, as indicated, are hereby reserved upon the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XVI, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

ARTICLE VIII (Reserved)

§ 166-22 through 166-25. (Reserved)

ARTICLE IX Speed Limits

§ 166-26. Limits established.

The speed limit for both directions of traffic along the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XVIII, attached to and made a part of this chapter, is hereby established at the rate of speed indicated.

§ 166-27. Posting of signs.

Regulatory and warning signs shall be erected and maintained to effect the above-designated speed limits as authorized by the Department of Transportation.

ARTICLE X Traffic Control Signals

§ 166-28. Traffic signals established.

Traffic control signals shall be installed and operated at the intersection of those streets described in Schedule XIX, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 166-29. Installation of signals.

The traffic signal installation shall be in accordance with the provisions of an Act Concerning Motor Vehicles and Traffic Regulations, Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the New Jersey Revised Statutes and shall conform to the design and shall be maintained in operation as authorized by the Department of Transportation of the State of New Jersey.

ARTICLE XI No-Passing Zones

§ 166-30. No passing zones established.

Somerville, NJ August 17, 2015

No-passing zones are hereby established and maintained along those streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XX, attached to and made a part of this chapter, as authorized by the New Jersey Department of Transportation in accordance with the sketches dated and numbered as indicated.

ARTICLE XII Street Cleaning

§ 166-31. No parking for street cleaning.

[Amended 5-6-13 by Ord. No. 2414-13-0415]

No person shall park a vehicle between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on the days specified upon any street or parts of street described in Schedule XXI from March 1 through October 31. All street cleaning regulations are suspended in the months of November, December, January and February.

ARTICLE XIII Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital

§ 166-32. Applicability.

The provisions of Subtitle 1, Title 39, of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey having heretofore, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:5-1 et seq., been made applicable to the property of the Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, a corporation of a public or semipublic character not for pecuniary profit, incorporated under Title 15 of the New Jersey Revised Statutes, lying along and easterly of Rehill Avenue, in the Borough of Somerville. The additional regulations of this Article are hereby made applicable to all the semipublic or private roads, streets, driveways, trails, terraces, bridle paths, parkways, parking areas or other roadways on said property of said hospital.

§ 166-33. (Reserved)

§ 166-34. Parking on or adjacent to semicircular driveway.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, on or upon any part of the semicircular driveway in front of the main hospital building on the easterly side of Rehill Avenue, opposite Steele Avenue, or in or upon any space or area adjacent to said driveway, except a doctor attending at the hospital in his professional capacity in response to an emergency call to minister to the needs of a patient or patients, and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary incident to such emergency.

§ 166-35. Restricted or reserved spaces.

No person other than a doctor attending at the hospital in his or her professional capacity to minister to the needs of a patient or patients shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area restricted or reserved, as indicated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof, as a space or area for the parking of doctors' vehicles.

§ 166-36. Manner of parking.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any manner other than parallel to or at such angle to the side line of or passageway through the particular parking space or area as shall be indicated by signs erected thereon and by markings on the surface thereof.

§ 166-37. Conformance with stall markings required.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area wherein parking is permitted except within and in the manner indicated by stalls marked on the surface of the particular parking space or area.

§ 166-38. Vehicular or pedestrian passageways; speed limits.

- A. No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof, as either a vehicular or pedestrian passageway.
- B. No person shall use, or cause to be used, any vehicular or pedestrian passageway through or over any part of the aforesaid property of the Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital solely for through passage from one public street to another public street, or for any purpose other than as means of entrance to or exit from the buildings or property of the said hospital.
- C. Speed limits. Speed limits are hereby established in the following area: within the block bounded on the west by Rehill Avenue, on the south by Grant Avenue, on the east by Post Street and on the north by Lincoln Avenue. No person shall operate a vehicle in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour on any portion of the aforementioned property.

§ 166-39. Loading areas.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof as a loading area.

§ 166-40. Handicapped parking. [Amended 3491 by Ord. No. 1094; 11/15/93 by Ord. No. 1158; 12/16/03 by Ord. No. 2153]

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by marking on the surface thereof as a restricted parking space for use by a handicapped person unless such person had been issued a special vehicle identification card or handicap plates or placard, by the Division of Motor Vehicles. Any person parking a motor vehicle in a restricted

parking space without such special vehicle identification card, handicap plates or placard, shall be liable to a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.) and up to two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) for a first offense and, for subsequent offenses, a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) and ninety (90) days of community service on such terms and in such form as the Court shall deem appropriate, or any combination thereof. These restricted areas are more specifically described in Section 166-81.

Notice of these restricted spaces shall be given to the public by placing a sign at all designated places as more specifically described in Section 166-81. All signs designating a restricted parking space shall conform to the specifications of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for streets and highways. These signs shall be so placed as to be easily read by pedestrians or operators of vehicles. In addition, any sign erected after June 1, 1990, shall state the penalties set forth herein which may be imposed for a violation. Any sign erected prior to June 1, 1990 shall be modified by June 1, 1991 to include the penalty information. The municipality may, by resolution, establish restricted parking in front of a residence or other housing unit for use by handicapped persons, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39: 4-197.5 or N.J.S.A. 39: 4-197.6.

§ 166-41. Stop intersections.

The following described intersections are hereby described as stop intersections:

Intersection Stop Sign on The emergency drive with the main access drive (opposite Steele Avenue) to Post Street The main access drive (eastbound and westbound)

The main access drive from Rehill Avenue (opposite Steele Avenue) to Post Street with the access drives (2) to the main parking lot Exits (2) from the main parking lot (southbound)

The main access drive from Rehill Avenue (opposite Steele Avenue) to Post Street with the exits from the 3:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. lot Exits (2) from the 3:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. lot (northbound)

The main access drive from Rehill Avenue (opposite Steele Avenue) to Post Street with the semicircular drive which passes the main entrance Exit from the semicircular drive which passes the main entrance (northbound)

ARTICLE XV Metered Parking

§ 166-62.1. Definitions.

The following words and phrases, which are not defined in Subtitle 1 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey, shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section for the purposes of this Article.

PARKING METER-PAY STATION (Metering Device) Any mechanical or electro-mechanical or digital device or meter, not inconsistent with this Article, placed or erected for the regulation of parking by authority of this Article. Each "metering device" installed shall indicate by proper legend the legal parking time established by the borough and, when operated, shall at all times indicate the balance of legal parking time and, at the expiration of such period, shall indicate illegal or overtime parking.

PARKING METERED SPACE-Any space within a parking metered zone, adjacent to a parking metering device, and which is duly designated for the parking of a single vehicle by lines painted or otherwise durably marked on the curb or on the surface of the street or lot adjacent to or adjoining the metering device.

PARKING METERED ZONE-Any restricted street or off-street parking lot upon which parking metering devices are installed and in operation.

§ 166-63. Designation of parking spaces.

The Chief of Police or designee is hereby directed and authorized to provide for the marking off of individual parking spaces in the parking zones designated and described in § 166-65 of this Article, said parking spaces to be designated by lines painted or marked on the curbing or surface of the street or lot. At each space so marked off, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle in such a way that said vehicle shall not be entirely within the limits of the space so designated.

§ 166-64. Installation of parking metering devices.

In said parking metered zones the Chief of Police or designee shall cause parking metering devices to be installed upon the curb, sidewalk or area immediately adjacent to the parking spaces provided in § 166-65 of this Article. No parking metering devices shall be installed in areas where parking is prohibited pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-138. The Chief of Police shall be responsible for the regulation, control, operation, maintenance and use of such parking meters. Each device shall be so set as to display a signal showing the legal parking time upon the deposit of the appropriate coin, lawful money of the United States of America, for the period of time prescribed by said section. Each device shall be so arranged that, upon the expiration of the lawful time limit, it will indicate by a proper, visible signal that the lawful parking period has expired, and in such case the right of such vehicle to occupy such space shall cease, and the operator, owner, possessor or manager thereof shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter provided.

§ 166-66. Operation of parking meters.

Except in a period of emergency determined by an officer of the Fire or Police Department, or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control sign or signal, when any vehicle shall be parked in any parking space alongside or next to which a parking metering device is located, the operator of such vehicle shall, upon entering the said parking metered space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited in said metering device such proper coin or accepted currency of the United States of America as is required for such parking meter and as is designated by proper directions on the metering device, and when required by the directions on the metering device, the operator of such vehicle, after the deposit of the proper coin, or accepted currency shall also set in operation the timing mechanism on such metering device in accordance with directions properly appearing thereon, and failure to deposit such proper coin or accepted currency and to set the timing mechanism in operation when so required shall constitute a violation of this Article. Upon the deposit of such coin or accepted currency (and the setting of the timing mechanism in operation when so required), the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle during the period of time which has been prescribed for the part of the street in which said parking space is located, provided that any person placing a vehicle in a parking meter space adjacent to a metering device which indicates that unused time has been left in the meter by the previous occupant of the space shall not be required to make a deposit of currency so long as his occupancy of said space does not exceed the indicated unused parking time. If said vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space beyond the parking time limit set for such parking space and if the meter shall indicate such illegal parking, then and in that event such vehicle shall be considered as parking overtime and beyond the period of legal parking time, and such parking shall be deemed a violation of this Article.

§ 166-67. Manner of parking.

When a parking meter space is diagonal to the curb or sidewalk, no person shall park or permit the parking of any vehicle in such parking space in any other position than with the foremost part of such vehicle nearest to the parking metering device. ~~When a parking metering device shall have been installed at the head of and immediately adjacent to any parking space on a municipal off-street parking lot,~~ No person shall park or permit the parking of any vehicle in such parking space in any other position than with the foremost part of such vehicle nearest to the curb; provided, however, that in the municipal off-street parking lots, signs shall be erected indicating that head-on parking only is permitted. In any event, a vehicle shall be parked within the lines marked on the pavement measuring such parking space.

§ 166-68. Violations.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this Article for any person to:

- A. Cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in the name of or operated by such person to be parked overtime or beyond the period of legal parking time established for any parking metered zone as

herein described, or to deposit in any parking meter any coin or accepted currency for the purpose of parking beyond the maximum legal parking time for the particular parking meter zone.

B. Permit any vehicle to remain or be placed in any parking space adjacent to any parking metered space while said metering device is displaying a signal indicating that the vehicle occupying such parking space has already been parked beyond the period prescribed for such parking space.

C. Park any vehicle across any line or marking of a parking metered space or in such position that the vehicle shall not be entirely within the area designated by such lines or markings.

D. Deface, injure, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking metering device installed under the provisions of this Article.

E. Deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter any slug, device or metal substance or other substitute for lawful coins or accepted currency.

F. Park or permit the parking of any vehicle in any parking metered space where the meter does not register lawful parking.

§ 166-68.1. Violations specific to certain sections. [Added 6-20-88 by Ord. No. 1049]

A. Any violation of § 166-68A, B, C shall be punishable by a fine of forty dollars (\$40.) per violation.

B. Any violation of § 166-68D or E shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) as determined by the court.

C. Fines shall be established by ordinance. Each year fines shall be evaluated. If the State of New Jersey adds certain charges or costs onto summons violations, said summons violations shall be increased by the same amount automatically.

§ 166-69. Reports of violations; citations.

A. It shall be the duty of the police officers, or Parking Enforcement Officer acting in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief of Police, to report:

(1) The number of each parking metering device or metered space which indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent to such parking metering device is or has been parked in violation of any of the provisions of this Article.

(2) The state license number of such vehicle.

(3) That such vehicle is parked in violation of any of the provisions of this Article.

(4) Any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation.

B. Each such police officer or Parking Enforcement Officer shall also attach to such vehicle a notice to the owner thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of a provision of this Article and instructing such owner to report to the Municipal Court in regard to such violation.

§ 166-70. Impounding of vehicles.

Any vehicle left parked for a period exceeding the maximum parking time indicated during the hours of operation specified in the space in which the vehicle is parked shall be towed, under the direction of the Police Department, to a garage or other place designated by the Chief of Police for impoundment, subject to redemption by the owner upon payment of the reasonable cost of towing and a storage for each day or portion thereof during which it remains in said garage or other place.

§ 166-71. Purpose of meter deposits.

The coins or accepted currency required to be deposited in parking meters as provided herein are hereby levied and assessed as fees to provide for the proper regulation and control of traffic upon the public streets and also the cost of supervising and regulating the parking of vehicles in the parking metered zones created hereby and to cover the cost of the purchase, supervision, protection, inspection, installation, operation, maintenance, control and use of the parking metering devices described herein.

§ 166-72. Collection of coins or currency from metered devices; disposition thereof.

It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to designate some proper person or persons to make regular collections of the moneys deposited in said meters, and it shall be the duty of such person or persons so designated to remove from the parking meters the coins so deposited in said meters and to deliver said coins or accepted currency to the Treasurer, who shall count the funds contained in such containers and deposit such funds in the usual manner provided by law.

§ 166-73. Parking or standing in on street parking metered zones.

Parking or standing a vehicle in a parking metered space in the parking meter zones described in § 166-65 shall be lawful only when not in excess of the maximum parking time indicated during the hours of operation specified and only upon the deposit of such amount as is prescribed by the following section. Parking for the periods of time indicated in said section shall be permitted only in those areas within the zones where parking is not prohibited or restricted to a shorter period of time by any other duly adopted provision of this chapter regulating the parking of vehicles.

§ 166-73.1. Parking in off-street parking meter zones.

No person shall park at any time upon any area in any metered off-street parking area except within a parking stall controlled by a metering device.

ARTICLE XVI Off-Street Parking Areas

§ 166-75. Designation of off-street parking areas; time limits.

Off-street parking areas are hereby established as described in § 166-77, and it shall be unlawful to park or stand a vehicle in such areas in excess of the maximum parking time indicated. ~~In those areas in which two (2) maximum parking time limits are indicated, the first figure shall designate the basic time limit and the second figure shall indicate that the Chief of Police is authorized by ordinance to designate portions of such area wherein such time limit shall be in effect.~~

§ 166-76. Parking meters and metering devices, use regulations.

In those off-street parking areas designated in § 166-77 where parking metering devices shall be installed, all such areas shall be subject to the provisions of Article XV, Metered Parking, not in conflict with any provisions contained herein.

§ 166-77. Schedule XXIII: Off-street Parking Areas.

A. The Chief of Police shall cause parking meters or parking metering devices to be installed immediately adjacent to and in front of each of the individual parking spaces or in clearly identified location within the ~~in~~ ~~§ 166-77 of the~~ parking areas designated in § 166-77 of this Article. The Chief of Police shall be responsible for the regulation, control, operation, maintenance and use of such parking meters or parking metering devices.

§ 166-79.1. Free parking in certain lots. [Added 8/2/93 by Ord. No. 1151; amended 5/15/95 by Ord. No. 1195]

The Borough reserves the right to direct the Chief of Police or designee to provide free parking at its discretion.

ARTICLE XVII Parking Facilities Open to Public

§ 166-80. Entrances and exits.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.R.S. 39:4-197, no person shall drive a motor vehicle into any parking yard, lot or other such place except by the entrance designated therein, and no person shall go out of said parking yard, lot or other such place except by the exit designated by markings on the pavement or a sign posted at the exit from said lot. No person shall park at any time upon any of the following described entrances or exits:

A. Parking Lot No. 1 (Central): ~~metered~~.

(1) Driveway from Main Street, opposite Union Street, to be entrance only.

(2) Driveway to Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(3) Driveway from Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(4) Driveway from Maple Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(5) Driveway to Maple Street, to be exit and entrance only.

B. Parking Lot No. 2 (Davenport Street lot): metered.

(1) Driveway to Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(2) Driveway from Davenport Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(3) Driveway from North Doughty Avenue, to be exit and entrance only.

(4) Driveway to North Doughty Avenue, to be exit and entrance only.

C. Parking Lot No. 4 (South Street): metered.

(1) Driveway to South Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(2) Driveway from South Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(3) Driveway from Union Street, to be exit and entrance only.

(4) Driveway to Union Street, to be exit and entrance only.

D. Parking Lot No. 6 (Bridge Street): metered.

(1) Driveway from Bridge Street, to be entrance only.

(2) Driveway to Maple Street, to be exit only.

E. Parking Lot No. 7 (East High Street): metered and permit. [Added 9-8-98 by Ord. No. 2064]

(1) Driveway from East High Street, to be entrance only.

(2) Driveway to East Cliff Street, to be exit only.

ARTICLE XVIII Handicapped Parking

§ 166-81. Handicapped parking areas designated.

No person shall park any vehicle, or cause any vehicle to be parked, in any space or area designated by signs erected therein and by markings on the surface thereof as a handicapped place or zone, unless said person or vehicle has been issued special identification tags or cards by the Division of Motor Vehicles.

These areas are more specifically described as follows:

A. Parking Lot No. 1 [three (3) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet A, attached to and made part of this chapter.18 [Amended 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1136]

B. Parking Lot No. 2 [two (2) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet B, attached to and made part of this chapter.18a

C. Parking Lot No. 4 [two (2) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet C, attached to and made part of this chapter.18b

D. Parking Lot No. 6 [two (2) reserved stalls]: as shown on Sheet D, attached to and made part of this chapter.19

E. Borough Hall driveway [one (1) reserved stall]: beginning at a point in the easterly line of the driveway at the front of the Somerville Municipal Building, said point being distant southerly one hundred seven (107) feet from the southerly curb line of West End Avenue and from said point running southerly fifteen (15) feet therefrom. [Amended 9-3-02 by Ord. No. 2129]

F. The most westerly parking stall located on the southerly side of Franklin Street. [Added 6-1-92 by Ord. No. 1118; 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134]

G. Parking Lot No. 5 [one (1) reserved stall] as shown on Sheet F attached to and made part of this chapter.20 [Added 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134]

§ 166-81.1. Restricted parking zones in front of residences occupied by handicapped persons. [Added 111593 by Ord. No. 1158]

A. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.6, the municipality may, by resolution, establish a restricted parking zone in front of a residence occupied by a handicapped person if a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates have been issued for a vehicle owned by the handicapped person, or by another occupant of the residence who is a member of the immediate family of the handicapped person, by the Division of Motor Vehicles pursuant to the provisions of P.L. 1949, c.280 (C. 39:4-204 et seq.), provided such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

B. Such a resolution establishing a restricted parking zone may be approved after a written request has been submitted by a handicapped person or a representative of the handicapped person for such a restricted parking zone and upon a request pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.6, submitting proof of possession of a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plate issued for the benefit of the handicapped person.

C. The restricted parking zones which have been established in accordance with such a request and resolution shall be reviewed on an annual basis to determine that the condition for the establishment of the restricted parking zone still exists.

ARTICLE XIX Permit Parking [Added 2-16-93 by Ord. No. 1134]

§ 166-82. Permit parking off-street.

A. No vehicle shall be parked in the off-street parking areas designated for permit parking in Lot 5 in Section 166-77, Schedule XXIII during the hours designated, unless:

(1) The vehicle is owned or operated on a regular basis by a resident of properties on Franklin Street, known as Lots 8 through 13, Block 62 of the Tax Map of the Borough of Somerville, and the vehicle has displayed on its dashboard, in such a manner as to be accessible to visible examination by an officer, a current residential parking permit.

(2) The vehicle falls under one (1) of the exceptions to the parking ban.

B. The following vehicles shall be exempt from this parking permit section:

(1) Visitors. A vehicle displaying a current resident parking permit may park in the designated off-street parking areas, provided that the operator of the vehicle is a bona fide guest of one of the residences within the permit parking area. The permit shall be displayed on the dashboard of the vehicle in such a manner as to be clearly visible by an officer enforcing parking regulations.

(2) Contractors, services and delivery vehicles. Contractors, service and delivery vehicles bearing the name and address of a commercial business may park without a permit during the time they are rendering service to a residence with the permit parking area.

(3) Emergency vehicles. Emergency vehicles and public service, telephone and other public utility vehicles may park within the permit parking area during the time they are rendering service or repairs within that area.

C. Administration. Application for parking permits under this section shall be made in writing on forms provided to the Borough Clerk/Administrator and shall be granted under the following terms and conditions: (1) To persons who are owners of the designated residences, one (1) permanent permit, valid for one (1) year, shall be issued.

D. Violations. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the permit parking provisions of this section for any person to:

(1) Cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in name or operated by such person to be parked in any of the areas designated on the attached Schedule "A", Sheet F, 21 as established as a decal parking zone as herein described unless said vehicle displays a proper and current decal in accordance with this section.

(2) Willfully defraud, misuse or improperly obtain any decal so as the decal is used for a vehicle or person not entitled to use that decal as described under the provision of this section.

E. Penalty.

(1) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of Subsection D(1), as set forth therein shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine of eleven dollars (\$11.).

(2) Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with the provisions of Subsection D(2), as set forth therein or who aids or abets any such violation or failure to comply with the section shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days, either or both of those penalties to be imposed by at the discretion of the Court.

ARTICLE XX Parking Deck
[Added 2-2-04 by Ord. No. 2154]

§ 166-83. Applicability of Article XX.

The provisions of this Article XX shall be applicable to the Parking Deck as same is herein defined.

§ 166-84. Definitions.

As used in this Article XX, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

ASSIGNMENT OF OPERATING MANAGEMENT RIGHTS – defining the borough rights to assign the operations management of the parking deck to a private company by entering into a contract/agreement detailing said assignment.

MULTI-SPACE PARKING METERING DEVICE - An electronic meter within the Parking Deck regulating multiple, numbered parking spaces within the public parking area which accepts coin or currency for payment of parking fees and charges for use of a parking space, and which dispenses a printed receipt indicating the numbered parking space and the time for which payment has been made.

NONPUBLIC PARKING AREA - Those parking spaces within the Parking Deck ~~numbered 1-18, 103-109, 178-222, 264-280, and 281-700~~ as designated on the Parking Plan.

PARKING - The standing or waiting of a vehicle not actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers or merchandise, unless in obedience to traffic regulations, signs or signals.

PARKING DECK - The parking garage structure located at 59 Veterans Memorial Drive East, Block 63, Lot 32.02 on the tax map.

~~PARKING PLAN - A certain plan entitled "Veterans Memorial Drive East Parking Deck Parking Plan" dated September 16, 2003, the original of which is on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough of Somerville.~~

PARKING SPACE - A space designated for the parking of a single vehicle by lines painted or durably marked on the floor of the Parking Deck.

PUBLIC PARKING AREA - Those parking spaces within the Parking Deck ~~numbered 19-102, 110-177, and 222-262~~ as designated on the Parking Plan.

§ 166-85. Designation of parking areas; location of meter.

Off-street public parking in parking spaces ~~numbered 19-102, 110-177, and 222-262~~ as designated on the Parking Plan is hereby established. ~~Off-street nonpublic parking in parking spaces numbered 1-18, 103-109, 178-222, 264-280, and 281-700 as designated on the Parking Plan is hereby established.~~ A multi-space parking meter shall be located as designated in the parking plan.

§ 166-86. Parking within marked parking spaces.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle: (a), in any portion of the Parking Deck which is not marked as a parking space; and/or (b), across any line or marking of a parking space or in such position that the vehicle shall not be entirely within the area marked as a parking space.

§ 166-87. Metered or permit parking allowed in public parking area.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in a parking space in the public parking area between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday unless: (a), a valid Parking Deck permit for public parking shall be prominently displayed so that same shall be visible through the front windshield; or (b), payment of the parking fee or charge for use of the numbered parking space for the period of time the vehicle shall

occupy such parking space shall be made by deposit of the proper coin or currency in the multi-space parking metering device.

§ 166-88. No parking certain hours.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in a parking space in the public parking area between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. on any day unless a valid Parking Deck permit for public parking shall be prominently displayed so that same shall be visible through the front windshield.

§ 166-89. No entry certain hours.

It shall be unlawful to enter the Parking Deck with a vehicle between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. unless a valid Parking Deck permit for public parking shall be prominently displayed so that same shall be visible through the front windshield.

§ 166-90. Permit required; nonpublic parking area.

It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in a parking space in the nonpublic parking area at any time unless there shall be prominently displayed in or on the vehicle, ~~a special permit therefor in form approved by the Borough of Somerville.~~

§ 166-91. Driving within Parking Deck.

- A. It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle within the Parking Deck in a manner inconsistent with any directional signs or signals regulating the flow of traffic.
- B. It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle which exceeds eight (8) feet four (4) inches in height on any level of the Parking Deck.
- C. It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle which exceeds seven (7) feet and no (0) inches in height other than on the ground level of the Parking Deck.

§ 166-92. Speed limit.

It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle within the Parking Deck at a speed in excess of eight (8) miles per hour.

§ 166-93. Damage to multispace parking metering device.

It shall be unlawful to deface, injure, tamper with, open, or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness or operability of the multi-space parking metering device within the Parking Deck.

§ 166-94. Only valid coins or currency permitted.

- A. It shall be unlawful to deposit, insert or place any object or tangible thing other than valid United States coins or currency in the multi-space parking metering device within the Parking Deck.
- B. It shall be unlawful willfully to defraud, misuse or improperly obtain any parking permit provided for under this Article XX.

§ 166-95. Parking rates.

- A. The hourly fee or charge for parking within the public parking area of the Parking Deck shall be defined annually by ordinance under parking fee schedules.

§ 166-96. Temporary suspension of regulations.

The Mayor and Council by resolution, and/or the Chief of Police by order, may, for special reasons or occasions, or in the event of emergency, temporarily suspend any provisions contained in this Article XX regulating the nature and time for use of the Parking Deck, spaces available for use, and parking fees and charges.

§ 166-97. Reports of violations; citations.

- A. It shall be the duty of any police or parking enforcement officer, acting in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief of Police, to report:
 - (1) The number of the parking space in which a vehicle is parked in violation of this Article XX;
 - (2) A description of the area in which a vehicle is parked in violation of this Article XX, if other than in a numbered space;
 - (3) The state license number of such vehicle;
 - (4) The provision of this Article XX of which the vehicle is in violation.
- B. The police or parking enforcement officer shall attach to any such vehicle a notice to the owner thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of the cited provision of this Article XX and instructing the owner to report to the Municipal Court in regard to such violation.

§ 166-98. Impounding of vehicles.

Any vehicle parked in violation of Sections 166-86, 166-87, 166-88, or 166-90 shall be subject to being towed, under the direction of the Police Department, to a garage or other place designated by the Chief of Police for impoundment, subject to redemption by the owner upon payment of the reasonable cost of towing and storage for each day or portion thereof during which it remains in said garage or other place.

§ 166-99. Use of Parking Deck.

No person shall utilize the Parking Deck or any portion thereof for recreation, sport, amusement, entertainment or other use not directly related to the parking of motor vehicles.

§ 166-100. Fines and penalties.

A. Any violation of Sections 166-86 through 166-92 shall be punishable by a fine of forty dollars (\$40.) per violation, provided, however, any person convicted of a subsequent violation of the same section within one (1) year shall, in the discretion of the court, be subject to the enhanced fine authorized by N.J.S.A. 40:49-5.

B. Any person convicted of a violation of Section 166-93 or Section 166-94 shall be subject to a minimum fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.) and a maximum fine of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.), and such additional penalties as are provided in Section 1-15 of the Code of the Borough of Somerville.

C. Any person convicted of a violation of Section 166-99 shall be subject to a maximum fine of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.), and such additional penalties as are provided in Section 1-15 of the Code of the Borough of Somerville.

Mayor Gallagher provided a brief history of the work of the Parking Task Force. The Ordinance changes being presented this evening are the first significant changes in parking in Somerville for over 30 years. Downtown Somerville has seen huge success over the past few years. This will allow a consolidation of parking into one utility to better manage parking in Somerville. The Parking Utility will allow for infrastructure improvements and maintenance in the Borough.

Mayor Gallagher commented that users of the parking lots need to begin to pay for the maintenance of the parking lots and this needs to shift away from the Borough Tax payers.

Colin Driver provided an overview of the Parking Task Force and their accomplishments since inception earlier this year. It was a well-rounded committee that worked as an active committee. On June 15, 2015 there was a report and a time line presented to the Mayor and Council. The next step was the Ordinance which is being presented for Introduction this evening. The draft Ordinance is 56 pages which are changes to the original Ordinance written in 1984. The main goal was to review was time of parking and cost of parking. The task force also looking at the creation of three parking zones in order to better control parking and revenue. The next Ordinance to be introduced will be the Parking Utility organization.

At this time, Mayor Gallagher opened the meeting to comments from the public.

Tom Biddle, 177 West High Street, Somerville, asked for the status on the proposed parking deck on West Main Street.

Mayor Gallaher replied this is still under consideration as well as a possible alternate location on the West End Redevelopment.

Rick St. Pierre, 18 East Main Street, commented that he is in agreement with the need for the increased parking rates, zones, and the Parking Utility concept. He asked for consideration to allow additional time on East Main Street for those parking for dinner and shopping. There are no parking lots located in this specific area.

Mayor Gallagher replied that there is parking lot 7 which has 150 parking spaces and is an untapped parking area. There could be better signage to direct parkers to this lot.

Gil, Business Owner on Division Street, Somerville, commended the Borough administration for their efforts on Division Street and the entire downtown. What is the purpose of the increased rates and enforcement. Are people coming into town for things other than shopping in downtown Somerville? He feels that the rates are too steep of an initial increase. This will impact those working in the businesses.

Mayor Gallagher replied that the employees should not be parking in the core areas.

Somerville, NJ August 17, 2015

Brian Gallespie, 11 Division Street, commented on the cost of additional parking costs for his employees. He asked if there was any consideration to offer reduced parking for employees. He also has tenants which he pays money each year to the Borough for tenants for these people to hunt for parking.

Fred Weid, 25 Somerset Street, Somerville, asked if could be any consideration for Somerville residents from other areas of town to come downtown and shop and eat.

Mayor Gallagher replied again that the overall intent is to take the burden off the overall taxpayer and to place it on the user of the parking lots.

Councilman Wilson asked for consideration of the stores on Main Street where there are quick in and out stores such as the paper store or coffee shops.

Colin Driver replied that there has been consideration in this area and it will be reviewed once parking equipment has been identified.

Rick St. Pierre commented that in the future there should be some consideration for the Friday Night Cruisers and the use of the parking meters.

Brian Gallespie, 11 Division Street, asked if there has been any consideration for an employee discount.

Diedre Roszinski, Parking Task Force Chair replied that this has not been addressed.

Kevin Sluka, commented that the intent is to have employees park further away from the downtown and they will be park at the same rate which would be in Zone 3 which is on High Street and also Parking Lot 7.

Herb Hall, 22 Faimount Ave, Somerville, asked if the meters will still take coins for those not using Smart Phones.

Mayor Gallagher replied that the intent is to have all possible options available for paying for parking.

There were no further comments from the public and the public portion was closed.

Councilwoman Kobuta made a motion and was seconded Councilman Utter to introduce Ordinance 2477-15-0817.

Councilman Sullivan asked for consideration to move the enforcement hours to later in the morning and possibly later in the evening.

Councilman Mitchell also agreed with this comment. He would like to see the hours of enforcement run from 9:00am to 8:00pm.

Diedre Roszinski, commented that the committee took into consideration of the commuters as well as the downtown Somerville resident.

Councilman Utter commented that these enforcement times were reviewed by the parking task force and also the DSA. These recommendations were also presented to the council back in June when the report was presented.

Mayor Gallaher took a census of the Council on the time of enforcement and it was a consensus that parking enforcement will begin at 8:00am.

Councilman Mitchell asked for consideration of moving the time limit to 3 hours on East Main Street.

Colin Driver, commented that the goal was to reduce the number of multiple parking times throughout the downtown.

Mayor Gallagher commented that the parking lots should allow for the extended parking time.

Councilwoman Kobuta recommended changing East Main Street from Grove Street to North Bridge Street to a 3 hour limit.

Mayor Gallaher took a census of the Council on the length of parking time on East Main Street from North Bridge Street to Grove Street/Warren Street and it was a consensus that the length of time should be 3 hours.

Councilman Mitchell commented that he would like to see the additional parking enforcement personnel enforce parking in other areas of town as well.

Councilman Wilson noted a typo issue on page 25 with the 10 minute parking on Davenport Street between Hunterdon Street and West High Street.

Councilman Sullivan asked for the Resident Permit Parking on page 27 be removed from the Ordinance as this is no longer resident permit parking.

WHEREAS, the revised proposal has been reviewed and found consistent with the Redevelopment Plan and the Borough's goals for redeveloping the area.

WHEREAS, on November 3, 2014, the Borough adopted a resolution conditionally designating 40 Haynes Street Redevelopment, LLC as redeveloper of the Properties for a period of 120 days subject to certain conditions; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Somerville that the conditional designation of 40 Haynes Street Redevelopment, LLC, 225 Gordons Corner Road, Manalapan, NJ 07726 as redeveloper for the development of Tax Block 50, Lot 3, located in the Kirby Avenue Redevelopment Area, for a residential project as described herein, is hereby extended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said extension of the conditional designation is subject to the following conditions:

1. That the conditional designation is limited to a period of one hundred and twenty (120) days from the date of this Resolution at which time it will automatically expire and be of no further force and effect, and the parties will no longer have any obligation to the other, except as to final payment of any Borough costs under the Escrow Agreement required herein. That 40 Haynes Street Redevelopment, LLC or an affiliated urban renewal entity and the Borough shall negotiate and agree upon the terms and conditions of a redevelopment agreement within the period of the conditional designation, as such period may be extended by the Borough in its sole discretion.
3. That 40 Haynes Street Redevelopment, LLC agrees to pay any and all costs incurred by the Borough from the date of the conditional designation to execution of a redevelopment agreement or termination of the redeveloper designation, as set forth herein.
