Somerville, NJ June 15, 2015

The second regular meeting of the Somerville Borough Council for the Month of June 2015 was convened on Monday, June 15, 2015 at 7:20 pm prevailing time in Borough Council Chambers 24 South Bridge Street, Somerville, New Jersey. The meeting was delayed due to an extended executive session.

Clerk-Administrator Sluka read the open public meeting statement and advised that the meeting was properly noticed in the newspaper and at Borough Hall.

Upon call of the roll, the following Borough Council members were present: Mayor Brian Gallagher Presiding, Council President Jane Kobuta, Councilman Jason Kraska, Councilman Thompson Mitchell, Councilman Dennis Sullivan, Councilman Ken Utter and Councilman Robert Wilson.

Also present was Borough Clerk-Administrator Kevin Sluka and Borough Attorney Jeremy Solomon.

The pledge of allegiance was recited by those in attendance.

The minutes of the June 1, 2015 meeting were presented in writing for approval.

Councilman Utter made a motion and was seconded Councilwoman Kobuta to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was approved by the following vote:

Proclamations & Presentations & Recognitions

Hillsborough Township HS Baseball – County Champions

Mayor Gallagher introduced Mayor Doug Tomilison of Hillsborough Township. As a part of a bet that he made with Mayor Tomilison during the Somerset County Championship Game, the losing Mayor would have to wear the Jersey from the winning team at their respective meeting.

Mayor Gallagher followed through on his word and put on the Hillsborough Raiders High School Baseball Jersey. He congratulated Mayor Tomilison and the team on their County Baseball Championship.

Mayor Gallagher welcomed Officer Miller to Somerville. He asked the he remember the community that Somerville is and the many outstanding volunteers that make up the community. He wished him well in this career here in Somerville.

Discussion

a. Introduction of Library Branch Manager – Doug Poswencyk

Mayor Gallagher formally welcomed Doug Poswencyk as the new Somerville Library Branch Manager and wished him well in this new role in Somerville. He asked Doug to provide a little brief background to the Council.

b. Mayor's Parking Taskforce Report

Colin Driver and Deirdre Rosinski of the Parking Task Force presented the following report to the Mayor and Council.

**Mayors Parking Task Force
Presentation of Findings and Recommendations
June 15th, 2015**

- In January of 2015, Mayor Gallagher created a Parking Task Force and appointed nine (9) "volunteers" to:
- Undertake a comprehensive study of the Boroughs public parking system
- Determine how it currently operates, and
- Make recommendations on improvements or changes to enhance overall parking performance, and to simplify the parking experience for the users of the system.
- Background

The Conclusions:

1. The paid parking system is based on a 1984 ordinance of which certain sections have been updated over time, however there has never been a review of the systems overall operation and management.
 - a. The only exception being the replacement of 571 parking meters with nine (9) pay stations in 2011.
2. Peak parking demand occurs when the Borough is not charging for parking.
3. There has been no significant increase to parking rates in the past decade.
4. Parking rates are among the lowest in the state of New Jersey for similar systems.
5. There is little or no differentiation between Main Street and off Main Street parking rates.

Recommendations:

1. Formalize a Parking utility to manage Borough parking operations
2. Create four parking zones each with different parking rates
3. Increase parking rates
4. Parking rates to decline as distance from Main Street increases
 - a. Zone 1, \$1:00 per hour
 - b. Zone 2, \$0.75 per hour
 - c. Zone 3, \$0.50 per hour
 - d. Transit Zone, \$0.25 per hour
5. Increase hours of paid parking to be from 8:00 AM until 8:00 PM
6. Raise parking fines at expired meters from \$23.00 to \$29.00 and in prohibited areas to \$40.00. Violation increase adds \$119,000 to revenue
7. Include Saturdays in the paid parking schedule; making the paid day schedule Monday through Saturday.
8. Ensure that parking enforcement is active during all paid parking hours
9. Upgrade parking system equipment
10. Pursue potential for public parking in private facilities to provide additional spaces during public events and festivals
11. Identify potential areas for future expansion of parking system
12. Upgrade identification signage and way-finder signage as needed
13. Review annually, paid "license to hunt for parking" fee's in lots 1 & 2
14. Ensure that all funds generated through parking services (fees/fines) are dedicated to supporting the operations and maintenance of the system per NJSA 40A:4 et seq, Local Budget Law
15. Define by ordinance that surplus funds generated from the parking system are dedicated to improvements and capital expenditure of parking system, and for Borough street repair and maintenance
16. Offer parking permits only in parking areas outside the SID

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Expected Outcome:

Should the recommendations be accepted and implemented, the following is an example of expected revenues and expenses over the first full 12 months of operating the new system.

- Use a conservative income estimate of \$893,916, based on Bier Associates model.
- All first year expenses, salaries, benefits, equipment purchase and maintenance, total \$825,032 or 92.4% of income, leaving an operating balance of \$67,425 from parking system revenue, excluding violation revenue.
- If violations remain consistent with 2014, an additional \$125,000 would be realized, bringing the total operating balance to \$193,884.
- In following years, expenses could reduce by as much as \$420,000 as equipment (capital) outlays would not be as great as the first year.
- Therefore, in a standard operating year, with income remaining constant, an operating balance of \$613,884 would be realized.
- This is an increase of \$363,884 or 145% in parking revenue compared to 2014 parking revenue receipts; this does not include any parking violation income.

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Mayor Gallagher thanked the parking task force for their hard work on this project.

The next step is for the Council to review the detailed report and come back with questions at the next Council Meeting.

He asked that there be a recommendation from the task force to leave the penny meters in place in front of the post office.

Councilman Mitchell commented that he would like to see the downtown business community educated in this report and to also get their feedback.

Councilman Wilson asked if there was any thought given to the Friday night cruisers.

Councilman Wilson commented that with the redevelopment success in downtown this task force report and recommendations are very timely.

Second Hand Dealer's proposed ordinance: this discussion was tabled pending further review with the Somerville Police Department.

Committee Reports:

Councilman Sullivan reported that final numbers for the 2015-2016 tax bills are being prepared and they are pending certifications before the final bills are printed and mailed. If they are late going out there will be a grace period for the 3rd quarter.

Councilman Sullivan reminded everyone to drive safely as schools are out for the summer.

Councilman Sullivan asked for the status on the valet parking program on for Wolfgang's Steakhouse on West Main Street. As he recalls there was an expiration of 7/1/15.

Councilman Sullivan made a motion and was seconded by Councilman Mitchell to extend the valet parking for Wolfgang's Steakhouse until 7/31/15.

The motion was approved by the following vote:

Councilman Kraska reminded everyone that the Spray Park is open. There will be a delay in the pool openings due to maintenance issues.

Councilman Mitchell reported on the Borough Community Rain Garden improvements.

Councilman Mitchell reported on the recent Flag Day Program and the success of the event.

Councilman Mitchell asked that the Somerville Fire Department begin to plan for the new home for Engine Company #1.

Councilman Utter reported 34 fire calls for May and 194 EMS Calls for the Somerville Rescue Squad. There were also nine (9) new members sworn into the squad.

Councilman Utter reported that there were 771 EMS calls between 7am-7pm with the paid day crews. Of these there were 539 patients transported and 468 calls were billable.

Councilman Utter reported on the upcoming comedy night events on Division Street beginning on June 18, 2015 with seating opening at 7:30

Councilman Utter reported on the Somerville Library Annual Book and Bake Sale on June 17-20.

Councilwoman Kobuta reported on the upcoming 7th Annual Arts on Division program this coming weekend.

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Open to the Public:

Diedre Rosinski, 108 N. Middaugh Street, Somerville, asked that DPW remove the green bags around the bottom of the trees in fall/winter to help prolong the life of the tree.

Herb Hall, Fairmount Ave, Somerville, thanked the Mayor and Council for replacing the police officer this evening.

Mr. Hall asked for an update on the capital budget projects.

Clerk-Administrator Sluka commented that he is waiting on the hiring of the new CFO before proceeding further with the County Capital Improvement Program.

Mike Duplak, 126 N. Auten Ave, Somerville, commented on the parking report and his support with the increase in the parking fees to support the parking operations in downtown Somerville.

There were no comments and the public session was closed.

AMENDING THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE EXPANDED WEST MAIN STREET REDEVELOPMENT AREA PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1ET SEQ.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset and State of New Jersey, as follows:

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the "Local Redevelopment and Housing Law," P.L.1992, c.79 (C.40A:12A-1 et seq.), by an ordinance approved on February 17, 2004, the Somerville Borough Council ("Borough Council"), adopted a Redevelopment Plan for the West Main Street Redevelopment Area ("Redevelopment Plan") as subsequently amended; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the "Local Redevelopment and Housing Law," P.L.1992, c.79 (C.40A:12A-1 et seq.), on November 3, 2014 the Somerville Borough Council ("Borough Council"), expanded the redevelopment area; and

WHEREAS, In furtherance of redeveloping the expanded West Main Street Redevelopment Area, the Borough Council has prepared the following amendments to the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, Prior to the adoption of the amendment to the Redevelopment Plan, the Planning Board shall, transmit to the Borough Council, a report containing its recommendation concerning the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7.e; and

WHEREAS, Upon receipt of the Planning Board's recommendation or if the Planning Board fails to transmit a recommendation within 45 days after referral, the Borough Council shall act upon this Ordinance amending the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7.

WHEREAS, Upon adoption of this Ordinance, the Redevelopment Plan shall be revised to include the amendments contained herein and the Redevelopment Plan shall identify the date of adoption of this Ordinance amending the Redevelopment Plan.

BE IT ORDAINED THAT, This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication in accordance with applicable law.
