The second regular Borough Council meeting for the month of May 2012 was convened on Monday, May 21, 2012 at 7:00 pm prevailing time in Borough Council Chambers 24 South Bridge Street, Somerville, New Jersey.

Upon call of the roll, the following Borough Council members were present: Mayor Brian G. Gallagher, President, Council President Jane Kobuta, Councilman Thompson Mitchell, Councilwoman Amanda O'Neill, Councilman Nicholas Stires and Councilman Dennis Sullivan and Councilman Robert Wilson.

Also present were Borough Clerk-Administrator Kevin Sluka and Borough Attorney Jeremy Solomon.

The pledge of allegiance was recited by those in attendance.

Somerville Police Department Service Awards:

At this time, Police Chief Dennis Manning presented the following service awards.

Officer Tim Franks was awarded the Valor Award for an event in January 2011, for disarming an armed suspect. Officer Franks also received a valor award from the Somerset County 200 Club earlier this month. Officer Franks was also received a minor injury during this altercation.

Officer Mark Butler and Detective Michael Stitley were awarded the Chief's Award for their efforts in facilitating the transition from local dispatch to Somerset County Communications.

Officer Tim Pasquale was awarded to Life Savings Award for this successful revival of resident Kari Plotkin of William Street, Somerville.

Kari Plotkin commended the actions of Officers Pasquale and Officer Claude Racine. She had just come back from her daughter's graduation in Washington, DC.

Chief Manning commented on the use of the automatic defibrillators and that all training is done in-house by Detective Michael Stitley.

Officer Brian Anthony was awarded a Life Saving Award for his actions at 35 Grant Ave in saving the life of a choking victim and also initiating CPR to successfully save a life.

Mayor Gallagher commended all the efforts of the officers of the Somerville Police Department and all the challenges that they face. The residents of Somerville are fortunate to have these officers in Somerville.

Mayor Gallagher went onto to present special honor bars to the members of the Police Department who were involved in Hurricane Irene and their efforts to assist during this weather emergency.

Discussion:

Proposed changes to the Road Opening permit Process (Division Street)

Clerk-Administrator Sluka reported that discussion continues on this issue. We are looking to increase the fee to \$100 and an additional escrow (more on Division Street). There will also be additional criteria for Division Street repairs.

He is looking to have the changes finalized for introduction at the next Borough Council Meeting.

Councilman Mitchell asked if this also pertains to sidewalk replacements.

Michael Cole responded that this would also be addressed in the proposed Ordinance.

Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Plan:

Mayor Gallagher opened to discussion on properties which are in the flood prone areas. The Planning Board is looking to jump start the East End redevelopment and what can be done with the flood prone areas. The solution will solve a number of issues. This includes the transfer of development rights which allows the development in one area and moving it to another area. This will allow for the movement to an area of higher ground which would allow redevelopment.

Borough Planner, Michael Cole presented an overview of the intended zoning changes to the Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Plan. The current properties can go up on stilts but this is cost prohibitive. The proposal would allow for a transfer of the development to the other side of the flood zone. The remaining properties in the flood plain would allow for parking and green space. This would maximize the use of the existing properties.

Councilman Stires asked how you would allow for the additional impervious coverage balance.

Borough Planner Cole replied that they would look at gravel and would have to be creative. We are trying to minimize the construction of parking decks in order to

Councilman Mitchell commented that after reviewing the plan he asked if this restricted transfer just within the flood prone area.

Mayor Gallagher replied that this transfer of rights would apply to all properties within the East End.

Councilman Mitchell commented on a issue in the past within this historic area where owners were looking to split parcels. He would like to see these areas of towns preserved in the future.

Councilman Wilson asked what safeguards would be in place to ensure property maintenance in the East End. This seems to be a very powerful tool for redevelopment.

Planner Cole commented that this would be an issue which would need to be addressed by the Borough Council in maintenance and also impact of taxes collected on the property.

Councilwoman O'Neill asked if the value of the properties differed within the area.

Planner Cole responded that in order to keep it fair, all valuation would be the same at the present time.

Councilman Sullivan commented that he likes this plan and this will enhance the appearance of the entrance to Somerville. This has been reviewed for the past twenty years and this looks like a shot in the arm for this area and also for the town as a whole.

Colin Driver commented that taking properties off the tax rolls will be a minimal issue while the increase in rates in the west end would be beneficial. He would also like to have an expression of interest document out to the development community once this Ordinance is changed.

Appointments to the Somerville Police Consolidation Task Force:

At this time, Mayor Gallagher made the following appointments to the task force. The Somerset County Prosecutor would like a recommendation by September 1, 2012. He would like to have these meetings open and also aired on Ville TV to allow for community involvement.

The following are the initial appointments; Art Adair, Ken Utter, Rich O'Neill, Steve Weinman, Chief Dennis Manning, Michael Stitley, and Susan Continden. There are additional names which will be appointed in the next few weeks. He would like to the first meeting within the next few weeks.

Committee Reports:

Councilman Sullivan reported on the annual strawberry festival at Vanderveer School on Thursday, June 7, 2012 from 5:30-7:00pm.

Councilman Mitchell commented on the Ordinance to re-allocate funds for installation of the traffic light at Davenport and Main Street. This will not be an additional allocation of funds.

Councilman Mitchell reported that the marker to commemorate the march of Washington through town has been replaced.

Councilman Mitchell reported that the Historic Advisory Committee has been reviewing a grant for the replacement of brickwork at Borough Hall. They are also reviewing the handicap ramps in the bluestone areas of town.

Councilman Wilson commented on Corrine Legge's retirement letter this evening. She is one of the best court administrator's in Somerset County and she will be missed.

Councilwoman O'Neill reported on the Recreation Department Memorial Day activities sponsored by the Commission.

Councilwoman Kobuta reminded everyone to visit the new Division Street.

Mayor Gallagher commented on the ribbon cutting of new Division Street along with the other events over this past weekend.

Mayor Gallagher commented on the discussion of possible closing of Division Street to vehicle traffic. There has been a push from the public to keep this street closed to traffic. The street will remain closed for the next 60 days in order to cure the concrete. At this time, no formal decision has been made and it will be addressed in the future after discussion with all parties involved including the merchants and DSA.

Mayor Gallagher presented a plaque from the Legal Runaround Committee which awarded Somerville the most "Healthiest Town" for having the most runners finish in the annual race on Thursday evening.

Mayor Gallagher also encouraged residents to attend the annual Memorial Day services at the South Bridge Street Cemetery at the conclusion of the annual parade.

Meeting Open to the Public:

At this time, Mayor Gallagher opened the meeting to comments from the public.

Wayne Palmades, Business Owner on Division Street, commented that business owners have suffered with the closing of the street. He would like to know if the street is going to be open to traffic as his store depends on traffic being able to access his store.

Mayor Gallagher replied that no decision has been made and it will not be made until after all parties involved in the process are allowed to weigh in on the decision making process. There is also an issue of parking to the rear of some of the properties.

Laura Wolf, 22 Division Street, Somerville, asked what will be done with the color of the pavement. It looks like a sea of grey looking out her window.

Mayor Gallagher commented that the project is not done and that there is more to come.

John Kurilla, 77 Eastern Ave, Somerville, asked why merchants are putting so much stock into Division Street. There are people are coming to Somerville just to see the street.

Mr. Kurilla commented on the reduction of taxes on the commercial properties. Why is the Borough Council making the tax payers cover the reduction in taxes.

Mayor Gallagher replied that this is the law with regards to a reduction in valuation of commercial property. If an appeal is filed the town must hear it and must follow the ruling.

Mr. Kurilla commented on the LOSAP payments and that he feels that volunteers should not be compensated.

Mayor Gallagher commented that this was approved by the voters of Somerville a number of years ago and is an incentive for volunteers.

Mayor Gallagher suggested that Mr. Kurilla stop and see the Borough Assessor Frank Betts and he will explain the entire process.

Mr. Kurilla commented on recent bonds which were issued and the interest rate which is being paid.

Mr. Kurilla commented on the possible raising of the homes in the flood prone areas.

Mayor Gallagher replied that this is very cost prohibitive to raise the houses above the highest flood stage.

There were no further comments and the public session was closed.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2389-12-0521

AMENDING THE EASTERN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR
THE EASTERN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT REDEVELOPMENT AREA
PURSUANT TO
N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 ET SEQ.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I Pursuant to the "Local Redevelopment and Housing Law," P.L. 1992, c.79 (C.40A:12A-1 et seq.) on August 3, 1998 Somerville Borough Council ("Borough Council"), authorized the Planning Board of the Borough of Somerville ("Planning Board") to undertake an investigation to determine whether the area known as the Eastern Central Business District, qualified as an area in need of redevelopment.

SECTION II Robert Catlin and Associates, in February 1999 prepared a report Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Study

SECTION III the Planning Board upon notice given, duly conducted public hearings on May 5, 1999 and June 2, 1999 and heard and considered comments from persons who were interested.

SECTION IV the Planning Board by resolution dated June 2, 1999 recommended the delineated area in its entirety as set forth in the document entitled "Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Study", dated February 1999

SECTION V On March 6, 2000 the Borough concurred and adopted the recommendation of the Planning Board that the delineated area in its entirety be designated an area in need of redevelopment.

SECTION VI Throughout several years the Borough Council and the Borough Planner conducted meetings and held discussions concerning the Eastern Central Business Redevelopment Area.

SECTION VII On January 22, 2008, the Borough Council at a regularly scheduled publicly advertised Council meeting discussed and reviewed the plan and allowed for public comment on the Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Plan prepared by Cole & Associates

SECTION VIII The Planning Board has approved the Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Plan in its entirety at a public meeting:

SECTION IX In furtherance of redeveloping the Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Area, the Planning Board of the Borough of Somerville on May 9, 2012 reviewed the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7:

SECTION X On May 18, 2012, the Planning Board of the Borough of Somerville recommended approval of the amendments to the Eastern Central Business District Redevelopment Plan

and has prepared a complete reprint, made available in the Municipal Clerk’s Office noting the changes:

SECTION XI Prior to the adoption of the amendment to the Redevelopment Plan, the Planning Board shall within 45 days after referral, transmit to the Borough Council, a report containing its recommendation concerning the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7.e.

SECTION XII The Planning Board has already submitted a recommendation however, they are afforded the opportunity to further their recommendation and upon receipt of the Planning Board’s recommendation or if the Planning Board fails to transmit a recommendation within 45 days after referral, the Borough Council shall act upon this Ordinance amending the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7.

SECTION XII Upon adoption of this Ordinance, the Redevelopment Plan shall be revised to include the amendments contained herein and the Redevelopment Plan shall identify the date of adoption of this Ordinance amending the Redevelopment Plan.

SECTION XIII This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication in accordance with applicable law.

AMENDING BOND ORDINANCE NUMBER 2286 FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, NEW JERSEY ON FEBRUARY 17, 2009

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Bond Ordinance of the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the "Borough") entitled "Bond Ordinance Providing An Appropriation Of \$1,185,000 For Various Improvements and Purposes For And By The Borough Of Somerville, In The County Of Somerset, New Jersey And Authorizing The Issuance Of \$391,400 Bonds Or Notes Of The Borough For Financing Part Of The Appropriation" finally adopted on February 17, 2009 (the "Ordinance") is hereby incorporated by reference in its entirety.

Section 2. The Ordinance is amended by amending: including the following additional improvement under Section 3(a) of the Ordinance, "Installation of Traffic Light on Davenport Street " and inserting immediately prior to "Improvements to various roads of the Borough, including but not limited to"

Section 3. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolutions in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 4. This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$391,400.

Section 5. All other provisions of the Ordinance shall remain unchanged.

Section 6. This amendatory bond ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final adoption as provided by Local Bond Law.

AMENDING BOND ORDINANCE NUMBER 2332 FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, NEW JERSEY ON JUNE 21, 2010

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Bond Ordinance of the Borough Council of the Borough of Somerville, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the "Borough") entitled "Bond Ordinance Providing An Appropriation Of \$485,000 For Various Improvements and Purposes For And By The Borough Of Somerville, In The County Of Somerset, New Jersey And Authorizing The Issuance Of \$237,500 Bonds Or Notes Of The Borough For Financing Part Of The Appropriation" finally adopted on June 21, 2010 (the "Ordinance") is hereby incorporated by reference in its entirety.

Section 2. The Ordinance is amended by amending "Recreation Department Improvements, as follows: (a) Pave Basketball Courts at Lepp Park" under Section 3(a) of the Ordinance and inserting in lieu thereof "Installation of Traffic Light on Davenport Street".

Section 3. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolutions in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 4. This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. Section 1. 

SUPPORTING SENATE BILL 1900 AND ASSEMBLY BILL 2921 WHICH ENTAILS THE PHASING IN OVER FIVE YEARS THE MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FUNDING TO THE 2007 LEVEL

WHEREAS, taxes on gas and electric utilities were originally collected by the host municipalities, and when the State made itself the collection agent for these taxes, it promised to dedicate the proceeds to municipal property tax relief; and

WHEREAS, just as municipalities collect property taxes for the benefit of school districts, counties and other entities; the State is supposed to collect Energy Taxes for the benefit of municipal governments; and

WHEREAS, for years, though, State budget makers have diverted funding from Energy Taxes to fund State programs; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative impact of years of underfunding has left many municipalities with serious needs and burdensome property taxes; and

WHEREAS, municipalities lost \$331 million in combined Energy Tax and Consolidated Municipal Property Tax Relief Aid (CMPTRA) funding in Fiscal Years 2009, 2010, and 2011, while also being denied scheduled incremental funding; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these cuts, in a number of municipalities property taxes are higher now, despite the fact that they are spending less, proving that the State's diversion of tax relief funding has overwhelmed local efforts to reduce property taxes; and

WHEREAS, S-1900, sponsored by Senators Paul Sarlo and Linda Greenstein, and A-2921, sponsored by Assemblyman Troy Singleton, would phase-in, over five years, the restoration of \$331 million in municipal property tax relief funding, and ensure that each municipality will be restored to the 2007 (SFY 2008) ETR/CMPTRA level.; and

WHEREAS, the sponsors recognize that the loss of those revenues has led to increased property taxes and has hampered local efforts to meet local needs; and

WHEREAS, the sponsors agree that the time has come to begin to restore to local budgets the millions that were cut to meet State needs in FY 2009, 2010 and 2011; and

WHEREAS, the restoration of \$66.2 million this year is a great first step, which should be easily manageable in a budget that is slated to grow to \$32.15 Billion in the coming year; and the restoration of \$331 million, in 20% increments, over five years will make a big difference in municipalities all around New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the bill would apply the protection of the 'poison pill' to the SFY 2012 distribution of CMPTRA funding, which will prevent further shifts of CMPTRA funding; and which will help to further restrain the appetites of future State policy makers for these municipal property tax relief resources; now therefore be it



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

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
