The first Borough Council meeting for the month of September 2011 was convened on, Tuesday, September 6, 2011 at 7:00pm prevailing time in Borough Council Chambers 24 South Bridge Street, Somerville, New Jersey.

Upon call of the roll, the following Borough Council Members were present: Mayor Brian Gallagher, presiding, Council President Kenneth Utter, Councilwoman Jane Kobuta, Councilman Thompson Mitchell, Councilman Dennis Sullivan, Councilwoman Margaret Weinberger. Councilman Robert Wilson was excused from the meeting.

Also present were Borough Clerk-Administrator Kevin Sluka and Borough Attorney Jeremy Solomon.

The pledge of allegiance was recited by those in attendance.

Mayor Gallagher asked for a moment of silence to recognize the recent passing of Roseanna Scaletti, a 26 year Borough Employee and Robert Erdman, a longtime Somerville resident and Borough volunteer. Also as we approach the 10th anniversary of 911 please remember these victims and their families.

The minutes of the regular Borough Council meeting of the August 18, 2011 were presented in writing for approval.

Councilman Utter made a motion and was seconded by Councilwoman Kobuta to approve the minutes and the motion was approved by the following vote:

Carried unanimously

Mayor Gallagher acknowledged through Proclamation of National Preparedness Month in Somerville and recognized all emergency responders for their efforts during the recent hurricane.

Hurricane Irene:

Michael Stitley, Emergency Management Coordinator presented an overview of the recent response to Hurricane Irene. Also present were Police Chief Dennis Manning, Fire Chief Greg Sheets., Rescue Squad Chief Steve Weinman and a number of department heads as well as members of the Local Emergency Management Planning Committee.

There was a significant amount of preparation prior to the hurricane including pre-event planning meetings, mass notification through Ville TV, E-Connect, Borough website and the Board of Education Honeywell Alert System. There was a decision based on the anticipation track and severity of the storm for Mayor Gallagher to declare a state of emergency on Friday, August 26, 2011 at 2:00pm and to also order mandatory evacuations of flood prone areas in town. These evacuations were required by 3:00pm on Saturday. The EOC (Emergency Operations Center) was opened early and was staffed by a number of individuals for a three day period. We were able to arrange for the majority of residents to seek alternate shelter rather than using a local Red Cross evacuation shelter.

There were five operation periods of 12 hours each. The Borough experienced two flood events, one at 2:00am on Sunday morning and another event early Sunday afternoon. The Borough opened a shelter at Middle School early on Sunday morning. There were a total of 1,100 residents evacuated and 92 were moved into shelters. There were a total of 23 water rescues and 65 fire calls and an overwhelmed police department that all acted in a most professional manner.

The Borough went into the recovery stage on Monday, August 29, 2011. The initial meeting with representatives of FEMA was scheduled for Wednesday, September 7, 2011 to discuss additional recovery from the storm.

Michael personally thanked Mayor Gallagher, Council President Utter and Borough Administrator Sluka for their outstanding efforts throughout the entire event.

Mayor Gallagher commented that there were a number of residents effected and asked that other Borough residents to simply reach out to your neighbors as much as possible. He was impressed how all of the events were handled in a very professional manner. He also highlighted an event during the storm on Sunday when the power went out at police headquarters and the emergency generator also failed. We were able to get a generator that was pre-staged from Saker Shop Rite and have the Police Station back up and running within two hours.

Councilman Utter commented that all emergency service personnel functioned well together and was able to adapt quickly to the rising water in areas in town that have never taken in flood waters before.

Councilwoman Kobuta thanked everyone for their response to this event. She is proud to be a part of this great town.

Councilman Mitchell thanked the Fire Department for assisting in cleaning out the public works department after the flood in order to get them back to normal operations. Councilman Mitchell commented on additional resources available to flood victims.

Voice over IP Project:

Clerk-Administrator Sluka reported on continued discussion with the Board of Education on a shared service with the voice over IP telephone system through their fiber optic network.

Renewable Energy Through Waste Oil Recycling:

Clerk-Administrator Sluka reported on a program which will reduce the amount of grease that goes into the sewer system and also pays money back to the restaurant for recycling their grease. This program has recently started in other cities in New Jersey and is extremely effective.

Committee Reports:

Councilman Sullivan commented on the resolution on the agenda that will provide an exemption from state and local fees for repairs as a result of Hurricane Irene. He cautioned residents as to the potential for scam contractors.

Councilman Mitchell reported that there was little water leakage into Borough Hall and the Library during the recent storms. He thanked the members of Public Works that were working to reduce any loss or damage.

Councilman Mitchell commented that Boy Scout Troop 84 was recognized for over 1000 hours of community service to the community in 2010.

Councilwoman Weinberger commented on the excellent job that Ville TV did during the recent storm in keeping residents informed of the events throughout the weekend.

Councilwoman Weinberger commented on additional resources available the NJ Department of Health and Senior Services for post hurricane assistance.

Councilwoman Kobuta reminded everyone on the upcoming 3rd Annual Jazz Festival on Sunday afternoon.

Councilwoman Kobuta highlighted the various e-government enhancements to the Borough including the E-Connect, website, on-line payments and on-line vital record requests.

Mayor Gallagher commented on a current ordinance that requires any flooded property which has damage and is required to relocate all utility panels above any flooding levels.

There will be a waiver for current single family residents although the multi-level units will be required to relocate potential flood areas from within the properties.

Mayor Gallagher asked that there be additional discussion on how to handle flooding in Borough facilities in the future.

Meeting Open to the Public:

At this time, Mayor Gallaher opened the meeting to comments to the public.

John Kurilla, 77 Eastern Ave, Somerville, commented on a situation involving a two family home and the registration of occupants. He wanted to know if there were any requirements that require the occupants to be from the same family. There are also parking issues involved.

Mayor Gallagher replied that there are rules on the books and that these can be addressed by the Code Enforcement Department. These properties are subject to registration and inspection.

At this time there were no further comments and the public session was closed.




