The second regular Borough Council meeting for the month of June 2009 of the Somerville Borough Council was convened on the above date at 6:40 pm prevailing time, in Borough Council Chambers 24 South Bridge Street, Somerville, New Jersey.

Upon call of the roll, the following Borough Council Members were present: Mayor Brian Gallagher presiding, Councilwoman Jane Kobuta, Councilman Thompson Mitchell, Councilman Dennis Sullivan, , Councilwoman Patricia Webster and Council President Robert Wilson. Councilman Kenneth Utter was excused from the meeting.

Also present were Clerk-Administrator Kevin Sluka and Borough Attorney Jeremy Soloman.

The Salute to the flag was done by those in attendance.

### **Committee Reports:**

Councilman Sullivan reported that the Borough Tax Office is sending out estimated tax bills based on the 2009 introduced budget. They will be due on August 1, 2009 scheduled payment. The budget will be adjusted based on the amount of additional state aid received.

Councilman Sullivan announced that Somerville High School was named to the Newsweek top 1500 high schools in the United States. This is a great achievement for the high school.

Councilman Sullivan reminded everyone that all schools would be closing on Friday and to be aware of the additional children on the streets.

Councilman Webster thanked everyone involved in the time capsule opening on Friday. It was a great day for Somerville.

Councilwoman Kobuta also wished to thank all involved in the time capsule opening on Friday evening.

Councilman Wilson reported that there would be a Gang Awareness seminar in Raritan on June 25, 2009.

Councilman Wilson reported that there is a state assistance program available for homeowners facing foreclosure. The website is [www.njforclosuremediation.org](http://www.njforclosuremediation.org).

Councilman Wilson thanked Mayor Gallagher, Kevin Sluka and Dave and Cynthia Hollod for their efforts with the time capsule opening on Friday.

Mayor Gallagher echoed the comments of the Council on the time capsule opening and concert on Friday evening. There were a number of people who made this event a huge success. He wished to especially thank Kevin Sluka for his efforts in coordinating this for the past few months. There were many issues that needed to be resolved this and Kevin did an exceptional job in coordinating this event.

### **Open to the Public**

Mayor Gallagher opened the meeting to comments from the public.

Frank McAleavy, 129 Bartine St, Somerville, asked that the small borough parcel of land on the Bartine Street dead end be cleaned up. This has become overgrown and needs some attention.

Mayor Gallagher directed Kevin Sluka to have the DPW address this concern as soon as possible.

John Kurilla, 77 Eastern Ave, Somerville, commented that the fire extinguisher and garbage can at the front of the room behind the head table can be seen on camera and does not look good.

Mr. Kurilla also asked how the high schools are rated by Newsweek.

Councilman Sullivan replied that there are a number of factors used. How many students are taking advanced placement classes and how well they are doing.

Mr. Kurilla also asked how education is is rated in Somerville and what does technology have to do with this rating.

Mayor Gallagher replied that this is a question which can be better addressed to the Board of Education.

Robert Bayait, 43 N. Middaugh St, Somerville, commented that he watched the recent NJ Assembly budget hearing on TV. He said he does not see and additional aid coming to Somerville.

Harold Willer, Somerville, wished to thank Mayor Gallagher and Councilman Sullivan for attending the recent scholarship dinner in Somerville

Phil Decker, 166 West Cliff St, Somerville, commented that he feels that everyone did a great job at the time capsule opening on Friday evening.

Mr. Decker asked if there was any redevelopment update for the downtown mall.

Mayor Gallagher replied that the redevelopment committee continues to work with JSM on a revised redevelopment plan. They are very close to a new agreement and JSM could be back in July with a revised redevelopment plan for consideration.

Mr. Decker also commented that he would like to see the pay to play legislation expanded to a regional or state level.

There being no further comments at this time, closed the public portion of the meeting.

### **Ordinances:**

The following ordinance was presented for hearing and adoption:

#### **ORDINANCE # 2306**

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF \$975,000 FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS AND PURPOSES FOR AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$545,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

#### SECTION 1.

The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Somerville, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the said Improvements there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$975,000, such sum includes the sums of (a) \$400,000 expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation and (b) \$30,000 as the down payment (the "Down Payment") required by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"). The Down Payment is now available by virtue of provision in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payments for capital improvement purposes.

#### SECTION 2.

In order to finance the cost of the Improvements not covered by application of the Down Payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$545,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not exceeding \$545,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

#### SECTION 3.

(a) The Improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which obligations are to be issued, the estimated cost of each Improvement and the appropriation therefore, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each Improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

(b) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$545,000.

(c) The estimated cost of the Improvements is \$975,000 which amount represents the initial appropriation made by the Borough. The excess of the appropriations made for each of the Improvements over the estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes authorized to be issued therefore and grants expected to be received as stated above is the amount of the Down Payment.

#### SECTION 4.

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the municipal financial officer of the Borough (the "Municipal Financial Officer"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Municipal Financial Officer. The Municipal Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Municipal Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Municipal Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Municipal Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

#### SECTION 5.

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

#### SECTION 6.

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses, and are capital improvements or properties that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the Improvements, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, taking into consideration the respective amounts of all obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 19.44 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$545,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$200,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

#### SECTION 7.

Any funds received from time to time by the Borough as contributions in aid of financing the purposes described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized therefore by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

#### SECTION 8.

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

#### SECTION 9.

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$545,000.

#### SECTION 10.

This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Mayor Gallagher opened the meeting to comments from the public.

Councilman Mitchell made a motion and was seconded by Councilman Wilson to adopt ordinance No. 2306.

## ORDINANCE #2307

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF \$50,000 FOR VARIOUS SEWER UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND PURPOSES FOR AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$45,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

## SECTION 11.

The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Somerville, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the said Improvements there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$50,000, such sum includes the sum of \$5,000 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"). The Down Payment is now available by virtue of provision in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payments for capital purposes.

## SECTION 12.

In order to finance the cost of the Improvements not covered by application of the Down Payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$45,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not exceeding \$45,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

## SECTION 13.

(a) The Improvements authorized and the purposes for which obligations are to be issued is for various sewer system improvements, including re-lining of sewers.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$45,000.

(c) The estimated cost of the Improvements is \$50,000 which amount represents the initial appropriation made by the Borough.

## SECTION 14.

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

## SECTION 15.

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

## SECTION 16.

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses, and are capital improvements or properties that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the Improvements, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, taking into consideration the respective amounts of all obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 40 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$45,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$15,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

## SECTION 17.

Any funds received from time to time by the Borough as contributions in aid of financing the purposes described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized therefore by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

## SECTION 18.

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

## SECTION 19.

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$45,000.

## SECTION 20.

This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Mayor Gallagher opened the meeting to comments from the public.

There were no comments from the public in this Ordinance.

Councilman Sullivan made a motion and was seconded by Councilman Mitchell to adopt ordinance No. 2307.

Councilman Mitchell again commented that this work is done to reline existing sewer pipes which prevents ground water from leaking into the sewer system.

WHEREAS, under the Somerset Municipal Banc Program (as defined herein), various municipalities, an educational services commission and school districts within the County of Somerset (the "County") and the County (each a "Participant") submit a request (the "Application") to the Somerset County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") to borrow funds from the Authority (the "Somerset Municipal Banc Program") to finance the lease purchase of certain capital equipment and, if applicable, other personal property (the "Equipment"; the financing of the Equipment under the Somerset Municipal Banc Program may be referred to herein as the "Project");

WHEREAS, under the Somerset Municipal Banc Program, the Lessor intends to provide funds to acquire the Equipment over time, and immediately lease the Equipment to the Authority, all pursuant to the terms of that certain "Master Lease Purchase Agreement" to be entered into by and between the Lessor, as lessor, and the Authority, as lessee (together with any amendments thereof or supplements thereto in accordance with the terms thereof, the "Authority Lease");

WHEREAS, under the Authority Lease, the Authority shall make rental payments solely from amounts received by the Authority from the Participant under the hereinafter defined Participant Lease;

WHEREAS, simultaneously with the Authority Lease, the Authority will sublease the Equipment to the Participant pursuant to the terms of that certain "Sublease Purchase Agreement" to be entered into by and between the Authority, as sublessor, and the Participant, as sublessee (together with any amendments thereof or supplements thereto in accordance with the terms thereof, the "Participant Lease"), under which Participant Lease the Participant will make rental payments that are subject to annual appropriation of said Participant in an amount sufficient to pay the corresponding rental payments applicable to the Equipment, and as appropriated by the Authority under the Authority Lease, plus all administrative expenses of the Somerset Municipal Banc Program;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the county improvement authorities law, constituting Chapter 183 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1960 of the State, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, specifically Section 37 thereof (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-79), the County may for the purpose of aiding the Authority in the planning, undertaking, acquisition, construction or operation of a public facility, guaranty the punctual payment of moneys for the purposes of the Authority (the "County Guaranty"); and

WHEREAS, in order to implement the County Guaranty, and in accordance with the terms of that certain agreement entitled Guaranty Agreement between the County and the Authority (the "County Agreement"), the County intends to appropriate moneys to the Authority to the extent the lease payments made by the Authority to the Lessor are not sufficient;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Borough of Somerville, New Jersey (the "Borough") as follows:

SECTION 21. That the Participant Lease, in the form presented to this meeting, be and the same is hereby approved, and the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer or Business Administrator of the Borough (each, an "Authorized Participant Representative") is hereby authorized to, and one of such officers shall execute the Participant Lease, with such additions, deletions or modifications as such officer shall approve, and to deliver the same to the addresses designated on such Participant Lease, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

SECTION 22. That any Authorized Participant Representative is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents and instruments and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for the execution and delivery of the Participant Lease and for carrying out the sale, issuance and delivery of the lease obligations, and all related transactions contemplated by this resolution.
